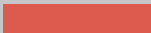

As you consider investing your heart, time, family, and finances into the life of a church, it is important for you to feel confident in church leadership. Our goal in sharing the details of Restores' leadership is that you can better understand that our church is structured to support the values of integrity, accountability, and spiritual authority.

Our church government is made up of three groups.

We are:

1. GUIDED BY PASTORS

The Pastoral Staff team is led by the Lead Pastor, Adam Barnes. This team oversees the day-to-day ministry and operations of the church. These staff pastors serve the congregation and are responsible for the development of the spiritual life of the church.

2. PROTECTED BY EXECUTIVE & FIDUCIARY TEAMS

Our Executive and Fiduciary Team members are Church Partners of the congregation and are appointed by the Lead Pastor to oversee the finances and provide counsel to the Pastoral Leadership Team regarding the major decisions and financial commitments of the church.

3. STRENGTHENED BY APOSTOLIC OVERSEERS.

The Apostolic Overseers are pastors of respected congregations and/or ministries who love Restore Church and its Lead Pastor and provide spiritual protection to the church. They may be called upon to help in accountability matters relating to the Lead Pastor if requested to do so by the Pastoral Staff or Executive or Fiduciary Team.

I. WHY SHOULD I BE BAPTIZED?

II. WHAT IS THE MEANING OF BAPTISM?

1. It illustrates Christ's _____ and resurrection.

'For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures...' 1 Corinthians 15:3-4NIV

2. It illustrates my _____ as a Christian.

'Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come:[a] The old has gone, the new is here!' 2 Corinthians 5:17NIV

"We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life." Romans 6:4NIV

Baptism doesn't make you a believer - it shows that you already believe. Baptism doesn't save you, only your faith in Jesus does that. Baptism is like a wedding ring - it's that outward symbol of the commitment you made to follow Jesus in your heart.

III. WHO SHOULD BE BAPTIZED?

Every person who _____ in Jesus and has accepted Him as Lord and Savior.

"Those who believed what Peter said were baptized and added to the church."

Acts 2:41NLT

"But when they believed Philip as he proclaimed the good news of the kingdom of God and the name of Jesus Christ, they were baptized, both men and women." Acts 8:12NIV

At Restore Church we wait until children are old enough to believe and understand the meaning of baptism before we baptize them.

We "dedicate" children in a family dedication ceremony which is intended to be a covenant between the parents and God on behalf of the child. The parents promise to raise their child in the faith until the child is old enough to make their personal commitment to Jesus. This is different from the baptism that is talked about in the Bible, which was only intended for those old enough to believe. The purpose of baptism is to publicly confess your personal commitment to Jesus.

IV. WHEN SHOULD I BE BAPTIZED?

As soon as you believe!

"Those who accepted his message were baptized, and about three thousand were added to their number that day." Acts 2:41

"Then Philip began with that very passage of Scripture and told him the good news about Jesus. As they traveled along the road, they came to some water and the eunuch said, "Look, here is water. What can stand in the way of my being baptized?" And he gave orders to stop the chariot. Then both Philip and the eunuch went down into the water and Philip baptized him." Acts 8:35-38

IV. WHAT ELSE DO I NEED TO KNOW?

1. You will receive a t-shirt at the beginning of the service you are being baptized in. Men can wear swim trunks. Women should wear shorts. Bring a change of clothes, a towel, and a plastic bag for your wet clothes.
2. You won't need to say anything publicly. Your name will be announced and the person baptizing you will confirm you have accepted Jesus as your personal savior.
3. You'll line up and enter the left side of the baptismal, get in the water, be lowered just under that water, exit the water, dry off and can watch others and then head to the bathroom to change.
4. We encourage you to invite your friends and relatives to celebrate this special occasion with you.

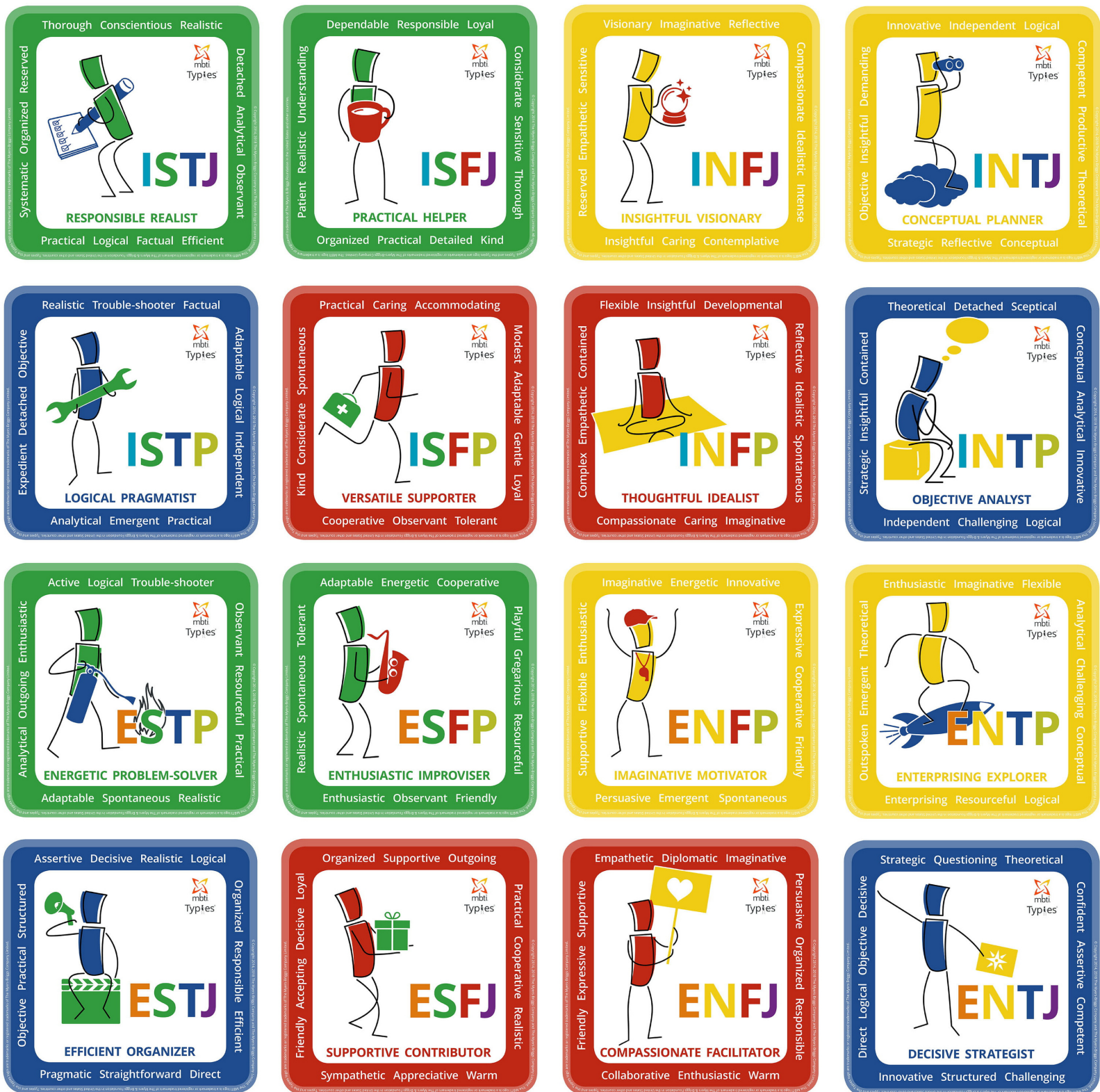

RESTORE CHURCH FINANCES



At Restore Church, we believe in the principle of tithing. We recognize that giving 10% of our income is the biblical standard for giving, and we practice tithing for the support of Christ's body, the Church, as God commands.

"Honor the Lord with your wealth, with the firstfruits of all your crops; then your barns will be filled to overflowing, and your vats will brim over with new wine."

Proverbs 3:9-10 NIV

"'Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this,' says the Lord Almighty, 'and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that there will not be room enough to store it.'"

Malachi 3:10 NIV

Giving is one of the central themes in the Bible. Jesus talked more about this subject than Heaven, hell, or prayer. To understand what it means to be a Christ-follower, we must also understand what it means to be a giver.

1. TITHE (Regular Giving)

The tithe, or "first fruits," of our labor/income belong to God. We find this principle all through God's Word. Tithing, giving God the first 10% of our income to the local church, is the primary practical way we acknowledge that God is first (Proverbs 3:9–10). At Restore Church, our tithes go to the Operations of the church.

2. OFFERINGS (Kingdom Builders)

An offering is giving over and above the tithe. The Bible says that by giving generously, we are able to "take hold of the life that is truly life" (1 Timothy 6:18-19). At Restore Church, Kingdom Builders is what we use to build the Kingdom through Future Christian Leaders, Local Church Expansion and Global Missions.

3. The Gift of Giving

The gift of giving is a spiritual gift that God gives to some people (Romans 12:8). It is a Spirit-given capacity and desire to serve God by giving of your material resources, far beyond the tithe, to further the work of God. Those who want to use their gift of giving to help accelerate the vision of Restore are part of our Kingdom Builders Team.

Many people love to give to God and want to feel confident in the organization through which they give. At Restore, we want people to understand they are giving to God through the church, not to the church. As we openly share the honesty, integrity, and spiritual values that guide the financial practices of Restore, we believe people can focus on what God is calling them to give and trust that He is leading our church to steward it well. The giving of tithes and offerings is worship to Jesus. Giving is not considered a business transaction but an act of worship and an expression of gratitude to God.

As Christians, the way we present ourselves to others is of vital importance to the way others perceive Christ. Our conduct should never be an embarrassment to Christ but should exemplify the best qualities of a mature believer and servant-leader.

Exemplifying the highest moral commitment, Restore Church leaders are to maintain a disciplined life of Bible reading, prayer, and fasting. You must also refrain from such things as:

- Profanity
- Smoking or chewing tobacco
- Gambling
- Indulging in too much wine or other alcoholic beverages
- Dishonest gain
- Illicit drugs
- Pornography
- Sexual immorality (sexual activity outside of marriage)
- All behaviors which might cause Christ to grieve and others to stumble
