MISSION SPOTLIGHT

Jim & Andra Howe visited us in January and reported on their mission in Nairobi, Kenya, under ACMI (African Christian Mission International). Currently, they are in Swahili language classes and attend an all-Kenyan church. One focus of their work is ministering to "street people," and mostly young girls, helping rescue them and guiding them. On Mondays they have a weekly Bible study for about 40 ladies and 55 children where a meal is served. There are three Kenyan men on the team who used to be "street boys." themselves. Now as Christian adults, they provide cultural guidance and walk the streets of the slum with Jim & Andra, where there is sewer and trash flowing. In 2023, a drop-in center was built where these "street kids" could come and spend time with the team. As part of this time, kids who come receive a Bible and have a time for study. The team also walks to where the ladies live, selecting a few each week, to get a first-hand look at their specific needs in their homes. It becomes personal and opens doors for ways these women can be further supported, such as a bed ministry, providing diapers for children, and recognizing health problems.

"We are trying to reach as many people as we can," Andra said. On Wednesday nights Jim leads a men's Bible study in the church, where they also started a children's ministry. As part of this, the Howe's have started a tradition of celebrating the children's birthdays. Currently, they are celebrating 12 baptisms in 18 months. Our Easter Golden Bowl is being collected to help with a building project for these "street kids".

Prayer Pals

Prayer Pals is a program at First Christian with a goal of covering our kids & families in prayer and aiding in developing lasting, intergenerational relationships inside the church. We pair each child preschool age through high school age with an adult volunteer. The adult will then pray for their child and family on a regular basis. The pals will greet the child at church and begin conversations to build a relationship. The pal will recognize significant life events (birthdays, baptisms, graduations etc.) with a card or small gift. Cards and small gifts are available at the church if needed. It is asked that the pals deliver a card/encouragement a minimum of 4 times a year. We have seen significant growth in relationships of our kids and their pals since the inception of this program. Pray for others fervently—with intensity, zeal and passion. James 5:16


Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ. Galatians 6:2
