During this time of the year my mind always goes back to the founding of our country and the men, although imperfect, who made it happen. I am reminded of the things they said regarding our country and their relationship with God. This country has never been a perfect place with perfect people. Still, I believe I live in the best country in the world, due to individuals who have a relationship with God through Jesus Christ.

I also love our flag. Kelly and I just put our flag back up after fixing the flag holder. I think "Old Glory" is the most beautiful flag in the world. Many years ago when I was in college we used to go visit the nursing home every week. We would take hymnals and sing in the hallways and also stop in the patient's rooms. One older lady who had a heavy German accent would always ask us to sing "The Star-Spangled Banner". The interesting thing was she didn't want us only to sing the first verse she wanted us to sing all the verses. Most of us never knew there were other verses other than the first one. Those verses were important to her and so became important to me. I believe she, like me, loved the last verse the best. She thought it was too important to leave out and made us sing it every week.

"O thus be it ever, when freemen shall stand Between their loved homes and the war's desolation. Blest with vict'ry and peace, may the Heav'n rescued land Praise the Power that hath made and preserved us a nation!

Then conquer we must, when our cause it is just, And this be our motto: 'In God is our trust.' And the star-spangled banner in triumph shall wave O'er the land of the free and the home of the brave!"

"The Star-Spangled Banner" started out originally as a poem called "Defense of Fort M'Henry". The poem was written on September 14, 1814 by Francis Scott Key. The story behind why he wrote the poem involves the battle for Fort McHenry during the war of 1812. I believe the song and the fourth verse give us some insight into the mindset our country's relationship to God. Notice Francis Scott Key felt like victory and peace were blessings and this country had been rescued by heaven. Notice his belief that "conquer we must" and "the Star-Spangled Banner in triumph shall wave", were potentially a part of our future and achievable under certain conditions. "When our cause it is just." "And this be our motto: "In God is our trust."" Our founding fathers believed this country had a Godgiven purpose to play in world events. I also believe this to be true.

I believe Scripture is clear that nations and leaders rise and fall by the hand of God. And because of this I don't believe it is accidental the United States holds such a prominent place in world events. Whether we continue in this way or not I suppose it depends on God's purpose. I think to it would be important we hold fast to the ideas of, our cause should be just, and we should place our trust in God, to strive to walk faithfully in God's purpose in our time. 


