PRAYER MINISTRY

The Bible has a lot to say about our enemies. If we are honest with ourselves, most of it we don't want to hear. The Bible tells us to love them, pray for them and work to overcome evil with good. What a challenge! This goes against every instinct we have. We feel like we have accomplished something if we can learn to tolerate them, but the Bible says to love them.

It seems like today everyone is our enemy. If they don't act, think or believe like we do, they are our enemy. All too easily friendships die and families are torn apart as fingers are pointed and declarations are made "You're the enemy!"

As Jesus hung on the cross, he looked at those crucifying him and prayed "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they do." (*Luke 23:34*) As Stephen was being stoned, he called to God and said "Do not hold this sin against them." (*Acts 7:60*) This was the attitude of men whose enemies ended their life.

If these men can pray for their enemies as they were dying, can we learn to show compassion, mercy, and grace toward our enemies? Can we learn to love, and yes, pray for our enemy? What does happen when we pray for our enemy? When Stephen prayed for his, God heard his prayer and used it to work in the heart of a man known as Saul of Tarsus. Today, we know him as the apostle Paul.

MISSION SPOTLIGHT

A New Year is a great time to get involved in local missions. Volunteering at Feed My Sheep kitchen in Fairfield is one way to impact others locally in 2026. Lunch is served Monday – Friday. Contact Lois at (618) 599-7315 to devote time and skills to this mission.

Keturah Richison visited the mission team and reported on work we help support through Casas por Cristo. Casas por Cristo organization are builders and serve working with local churches and pastors. The mission has a presence in the following countries: Dominican Republic, Guatemala, Honduras, Mexico, and Nicaragua.

Build – The mission builds homes for families needing to be reminded that Jesus loves them. It builds relationships between volunteers, families, and pastors that would otherwise never have met. “We strive to build the Kingdom of God by partnering with other local churches and ministries. We strive to build opportunities for growth by creating structured experiences that challenge our volunteers to be stretched beyond their comfort zones.”

Serve – “Through the building process, God allows us to interact with our teams, local families, pastors, churches, vendors, and fellow missionaries. We do not want to take any of these interactions for granted. We believe these are unique opportunities presented to us by God to serve each other.”

Casas por Cristo began building homes along the U.S. / México border in 1993. It has expanded to five countries in its 30 years of ministry and provided over 7,000 families with homes. “We are dedicated to meeting the physical need of better housing as a way of also meeting the spiritual need for Jesus Christ.”

In 2025, 300 homes were built with 2026 anticipating 320 homes. Accommodating the growth includes a new facility that will house multiple groups building homes. Keturah’s role is primarily in team recruitment. 2025 recorded 38 first-time groups building a home. First Christian partnered and sent a group in 2023 to build a home for a family in Guatemala.



Joshua and Abigail Meadows are missionaries we support in Ishinomaki, Japan. Abigail is also the granddaughter of Tamara Vail. They returned to the States for a few weeks and made a stop to share with us at First Christian Church in December to give us an update. We are always eager and grateful to hear what God is doing in the field.
