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#### **INTRODUCTION TO "WHO IS JESUS?..."**

"We must imitate Christ's life and his ways if we are to be truly enlightened and set free from the darkness of our own hearts. Let it be the most important thing we do, then, to reflect on the life of Jesus Christ" Thomas a Kempis.

Jesus once asked his disciples what people were saying about him. "Who do others say I am?" he asked. The disciples had various responses until Peter stepped up and said, "you are the Christ" (Matthew 16:13-16). We believe Jesus has the words of eternal life. As people who are committed to being his apprentices in life, it is important to wrestle with the character and nature of Jesus. Join us over these next weeks as we explore the nature of Jesus and invite all of us to a deep life of faith - trusting and believing the ways of Jesus lead to eternal life.

The Apostle Paul tells us that Jesus is the visible image of the invisible God - that when we look at Jesus, we are looking into the very character of God (Colossians 1:15-20). One of the practices we engage in is to gaze our attention on Jesus - to allow his wisdom and nature to direct our lives. What we find when we gaze on Jesus is that He is the source of all life - that in him we move and have our being (Acts 17:28).

So, journey with us as we explore in deep ways the person of Jesus Christ. We invite you to write, take notes, meditate on Colossians 1:15-20, use questions to prompt discussion, spend unhurried time with Jesus and further engage with our gatherings.

#### **HOW TO USE THE JOURNAL:**

This journal has been prepared for your personal reflection, note taking, devotional conversations and as a tool for deeper study.

We give them to you as tools to be used as you will. Please feel no obligation to fill out everything in the journal. Put away the temptation to be an over-achiever and task master. The point here is to dive deeper in the Scripture and allow it to shape us not to earn brownie points for getting through it fastest :)

We are more fully formed into the image of Christ as we take on his action and reflect deeply on His story. We hope you find this resource helpful and encouraging.

#### SPIRITUAL PRACTICE: MEDITATING ON COLOSSIANS 1:15-20

Christian contemplation is the steady gaze of our soul on the God who loves us. It is focused thought on the nature and character of God and allowing that to give shape to our life and action. To one degree or another, to be a Christian is to be a contemplative. The practice of meditating on Scripture is one way our thoughts can be centered on Christ above all else.

We are bombarded with messages and ideas all the time. If we are going to live according to the way of the Kingdom and find a purposeful life, we will need to take our thoughts captive. During this series, we invite you to slowly meditate on Colossians 1:15-20 each week.

#### **SPIRITUAL PRACTICE CONTINUED...**

Instructions are simple: (a) find a quiet place. (b) read over the passage slowly. (c) pay attention to ideas/concepts that capture your attention. (d) ask God, 'what do you want me to know?'. (e) sit quietly and listen with your heart open. Perhaps the Lord will draw your mind to something throughout the day. (f) thank the Lord for your time (could be 5 minutes or 25 minutes – the goal is to learn to be with God in Scripture).

Avoid trying to make more of your time than necessary. The goal is not always to 'get something' from your meditation. Meditation is about spending unhurried time with the Lord.
