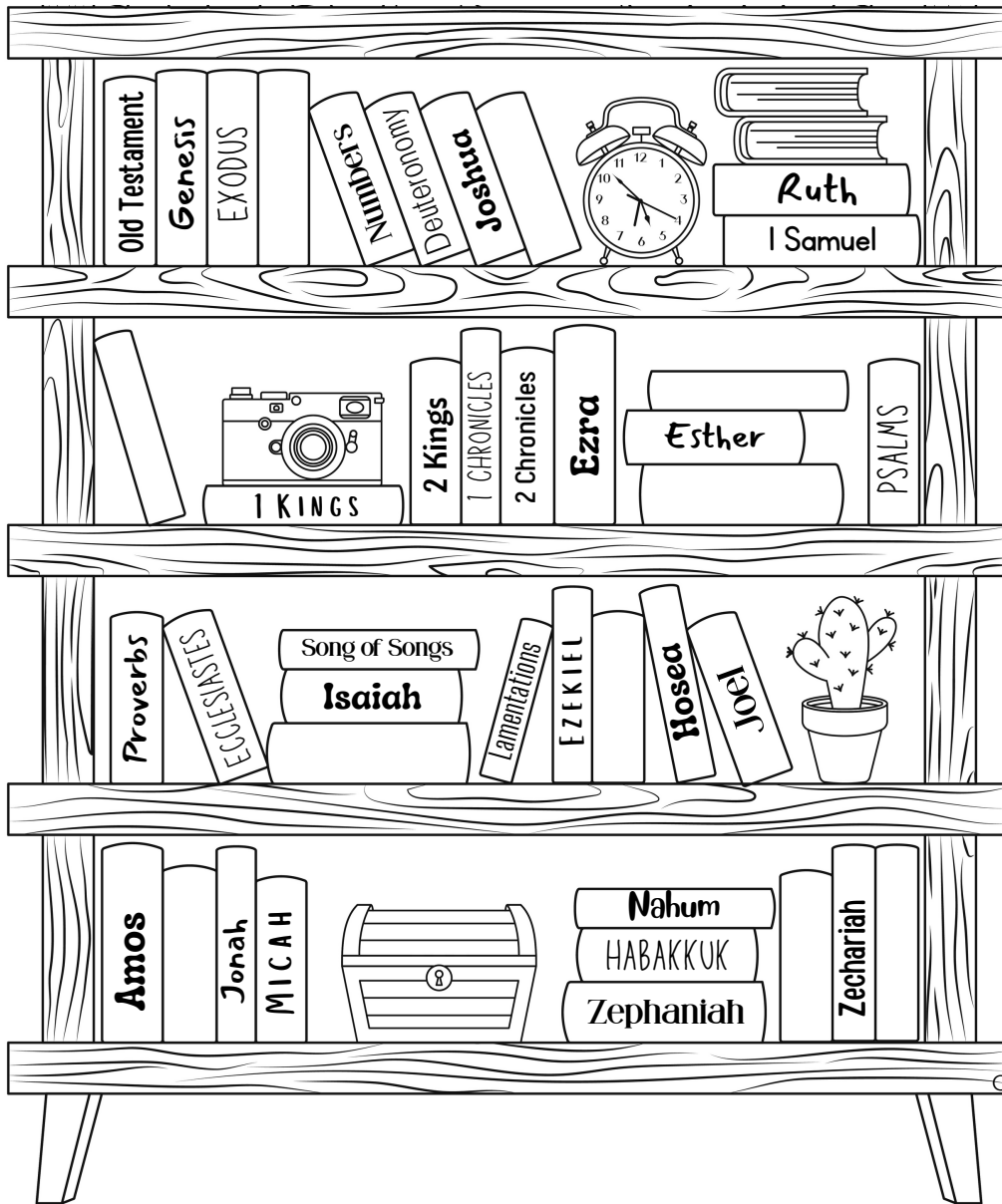

I'm forgiven. What an awesome statement. We are forgiven because our great God sent His one and only Son, Jesus, to take our punishment on the cross for our sin. It's an incredible gift we can choose to accept or deny. If you accept this gift (Ephesians 2:8-9), you can rejoice and have hope and confidence knowing you are a child of the one true God. You are saved from the penalty of your sin forever!

How do we live our lives as forgiven people, even though we continue to sin? As a child of God, it is important we admit our sins and confess them to God. After we admit we are wrong, we need to repent, which means we change our actions, attitudes, or thoughts.

This week, let's teach our children to recognize their sin, admit it is wrong (based on God's standards), and repent (change the behavior). When our children do this, we get to model God's beautiful forgiveness! Then we can celebrate their repentance and remind them that they are loved.

#### Take the Family Challenge

Each evening this week, take a few minutes before bed to talk about your day as a family. Talk about both the good things and the bad things. If you think of any sins that need to be confessed to God, use this opportunity to pray and practice confessing sin to God (older kids can do this by themselves, younger kids can pray with a parent). As you pray, specifically state what you did wrong and ask God for forgiveness. After you pray, talk about the importance of repenting (changing our actions) and about God's love. Read 1 John 1:9 and John 3:16 together.

8. If you have been forgiven and rescued from the punishment of your sin, you are a Christian; how often should you admit, confess, and repent? Why?

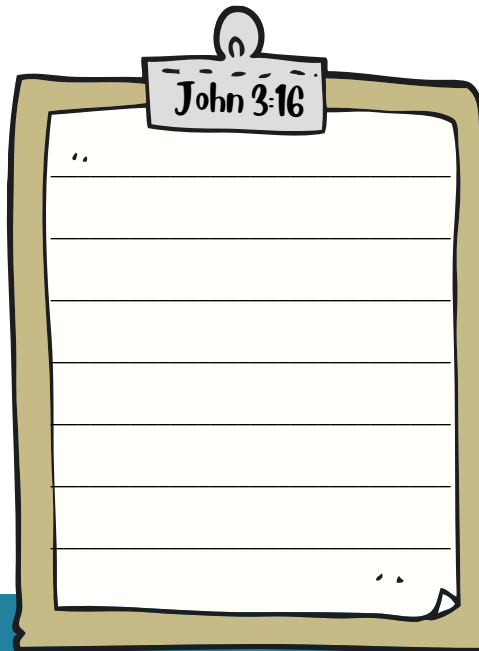

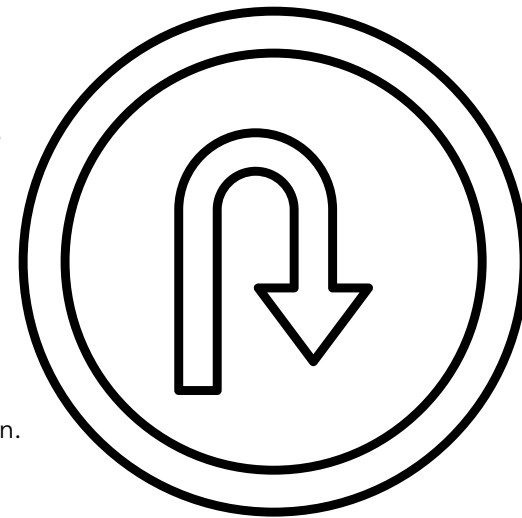


## DO RIGHT

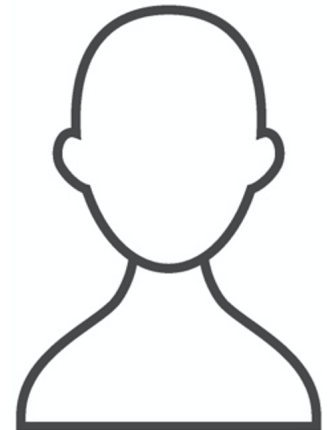
Create a cool design in the "u-turn" sign.
