Do your kids understand the difference between a want and a need? In today's Bible lesson, we looked at Elijah's life and learned through his difficult experiences. These experiences remind us that we can trust God to provide for all our needs. What happens if God doesn't provide instantly? We can find encouragement from one of our previous lessons on David and Saul. David had to patiently trust God and learn through experiences before he became king. As we coach our children spiritually, we can help them recall what they've learned from God's Word, so they can apply it to their lives.

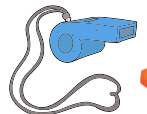
