

TOP 12 VERSES

Four of the Top 12 verses are listed below. How many of them does your child know? Choose an activity to help your child learn them!

1. As a family, pick a verse, look it up in your Bible, and then read it together.
2. Choose a verse and write it on a notecard. Place it next to your child's bed and review the verse each night before going to bed.
3. Choose one verse to review each night at dinner. Once your family knows the verse, have your child color the shape. Then pick a new verse to memorize.



John 14:2: In my Father's house are many rooms; if it were not so, I would have told you. I am going there to prepare a place for you.



Romans 3:23: For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God.



Joshua 1:9: Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be terrified; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go.



Mark 12:30-31: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength." The second is this: "Love your neighbor as yourself." There is no commandment greater than these.

2 Chronicles 1:1-12, 3:1 - 7:22

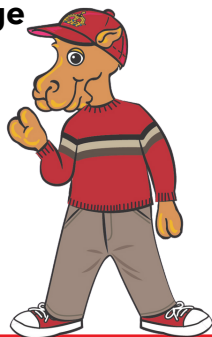
Hey parents!

"And you, my son Solomon, acknowledge the God of your father, and serve Him with wholehearted devotion and with a willing mind, for the Lord searches every heart and understands every desire and every thought. If you seek Him, He will be found by you; but if you forsake Him, He will reject you forever. Consider now, for the Lord has chosen you to build a temple as a sanctuary. Be strong and do the work." 1 Chronicles 28:9-10

As parents, we can learn from and apply David's advice as we mold our children to be wise according to God's standards.

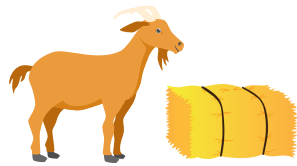
YOU DID IT!

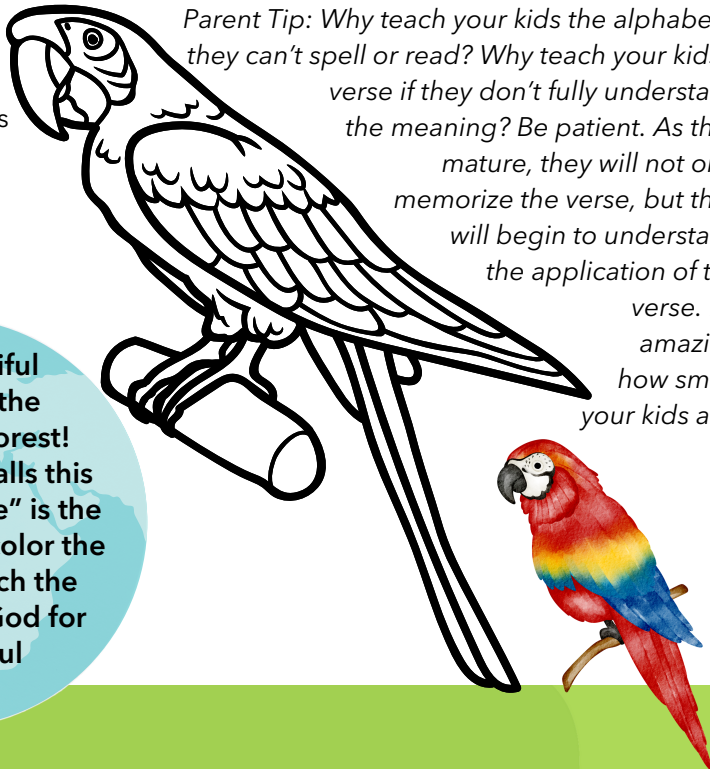


THINK RIGHT Romans 3:23 (Top 12)

"For all (hands from center going outward) **have sinned** (two thumbs down and look sad) **and fall short** (squat) **of the glory of God** (stand up while pointer fingers twirl pointing up)." **Romans 3:23**

Does your child like to play with trains or dolls? Have them create a "verse station" or a "verse swing." Every time the train passes the verse station, have them recite their verse. Or have them take a doll to the "verse swing" and swing their doll while they say the verse. Incorporating the verse into repetitious play makes the verse fun for your children as they memorize.

Parent Tip: Why teach your kids the alphabet if they can't spell or read? Why teach your kids a verse if they don't fully understand the meaning? Be patient. As they mature, they will not only memorize the verse, but they will begin to understand the application of the verse. It's amazing how smart your kids are!



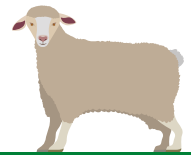
LET'S GO!
