Hey parents!

I'm forgiven. What an awesome statement. We are forgiven because our great God sent His one and only Son, Jesus, to take our punishment on the cross for our sin. It's an incredible gift we can choose to accept or deny. If you accept this gift (Ephesians 2:8-9), you can rejoice and have hope and confidence knowing you are a child of the one true God. You are saved from the penalty of your sin forever!

How do we live our lives as forgiven people, even though we continue to sin? As a child of God, it is important we admit our sins and confess them to God. After you admit you are wrong, you need to repent, which means you change your actions, attitudes, or thoughts. This week, we challenge you to teach your children to recognize their sin, admit it is wrong (based on God's standards), and repent (change the behavior). When our children do this, we get to model God's beautiful forgiveness! Celebrate your child's repentance and remind them that they are loved.

Take the Family Challenge

As you read a bedtime story to your child, highlight when people sin. Remind your child what sin is (anything we think, say, or do that is against God). Ask your child what they should do when they sin (adimit, confess, repent).

For even more learning, have the same discussion while watching TV shows.






When you sin, God wants you to do what King David did.
