

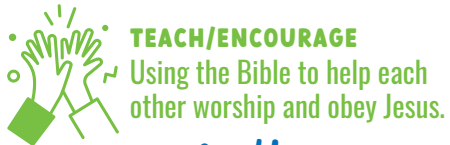
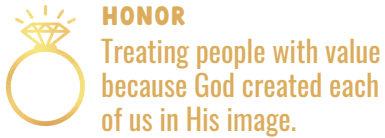
The "One Anothers"

WHAT DID WE DISCOVER TODAY?

1 Kings 17

Hey parents!

Do your kids understand the difference between a want and a need? In today's Bible lesson, we looked at Elijah's life and learned through his difficult experiences. These experiences remind us that we can trust God to provide for all our needs. What happens if God doesn't provide instantly? We can find encouragement from one of our previous lessons on David and Saul. David had to patiently trust God and learn through experiences before he became king.

Why are these lessons important for young children? As parents, we get to help our kids know that God is our Provider. We can model this by praying and thanking God for providing a place to sleep, food, and friends. A good time to pray is before meals and before bed.

Take the Family Challenge

Make a small reminder to thank God before meals and before bed. Encourage your children to pray from their hearts and to be specific while thanking God for providing for their needs.

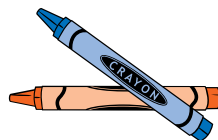
