**In this brochure**, you will explore how God has uniquely made you by answering some questions about your spiritual gifts, your heart, your talents, your personality, and experience.

The first part of this survey is a Spiritual Gifts Test. Spiritual gifts are special abilities that God gives, according to his grace, to each member of the body of Christ to be used for the development of the church. Lists of specific spiritual gifts are found in Roman 12, 1 Corinthians 12, Ephesians 4, and 1 Peter 4:9-10. We can determine what gifts God has given us by several means: prayer, serving in various areas in the church, asking the opinions of others, and tests or surveys like this pamphlet.

**Directions for the Spiritual Gifts Test:** Respond to each statement on the Spiritual Gift Test pages which follow, according to the scale below. Write your score for each question in the corresponding box.

1. I am willing and able to learn executive skills such as planning, organizing, and delegating.
2. There are times I sense that a particular teaching is unbiblical.
3. I enjoy sharing the message of the Gospel.
4. I desire to give hope to those who are depressed.
5. I have assurance that God answers prayers.
6. I feel deeply moved when confronted with the urgent financial needs of others.
7. I get much satisfaction from hosting persons who need ministry at my home.
8. I am concerned to read, study and learn Biblical truths.
9. I find it easy to motivate others to follow through on a ministry project.
10. I hurt for others who are poverty-stricken, physically sick, a stranger, or imprisoned.
11. I am ready to commit myself to care for the spiritual welfare of a group of Christians.
12. I usually have a readiness to take on helping or supportive roles.
13. I have a desire to teach biblical truths in such a way that they are accurately understood and applied properly.
14. I often pray and ask God for wisdom, before making major or difficult decisions.

# Spiritual Gifts Key

(After you have answered all of the preceding questions, record your scores in the right-hand column. The letters on the score sheet correspond to the spiritual gifts described here.)

Letter	Spiritual Gift / Description	Your Score:
A	<b>Administration (1 Cor 12:28)</b> – Someone with this gift enjoys and is usually skilled in planning and organizing. They might be gifted in delegation or in handling the details of a project or ministry.	
B	<b>Discernment (1 Cor 12:10)</b> – Certain individuals are especially gifted in being able to discern truth from error, or sincere believers from false deceivers. Jesus said many would come in His name and would deceive many (Matthew 24:4-5), but the gift of discernment is given to the Church to protect it from such as these.	
C	<b>Evangelism (Eph 4:11)</b> – Those with this gift have the ability to successfully communicate the message of the Gospel, especially to nonbelievers. A person with this gift has both the desire and courage to preach the good news to those who need to be saved.	
D	<b>Encouragement/Exhortation (Rom 12:8)</b> – This gift has two parts: 1. Encouragement - Someone with this gift is naturally skilled in offering comfort and support to help someone in times of difficulty. They seek out those who are hurting or discouraged. And 2: Exhortation – a person with this skill isn't afraid to speak truth to someone, in love. They are willing to challenge someone to make the right choices, or to talk with someone honestly when few others will.	
E	<b>Faith (1 Cor 12:9)</b> – All believers possess faith in some measure because it is one of the gifts of the Spirit bestowed on all who come to Christ in faith (Galatians 5:22-23). The spiritual gift of faith is exhibited by one with a strong and unshakeable confidence in God, His Word, and His promises.	
F	<b>Giving (Rom 12:8)</b> – While all are called to give, gifted givers are those who joyfully share what they have with others, especially in financial or material ways. The giver is concerned for the needs of others and also is generous toward the work of the Kingdom.	



<b>G</b>	<b>Hospitality (1 Pet 4:9-10)</b> – Someone with this gift has a natural ability to make people feel welcome in one’s own home or church as a means of encouraging or serving them.	
<b>H</b>	<b>(Word of) Knowledge (1 Cor 12:8)</b> – This gift involves understanding truth with an insight that only comes by knowing and understanding God’s Word. Those with the gift of knowledge desire to know His Word more fully, and desire to share it with others.	
<b>I</b>	<b>Leadership (Rom 12:8)</b> – The gifted leader is one who rules, presides over, or has the management of other people in the church. The word literally means “guide” and carries with it the idea of one who steers a ship. One with the gift of leadership rules with wisdom and grace and exhibits the fruit of the Spirit in his life as he leads by example.	
<b>J</b>	<b>Mercy (Rom 12:8)</b> – Closely linked with the gift of encouragement, the gift of mercy is obvious in those who are compassionate toward others who are in distress, showing sympathy and sensitivity coupled with a desire and the resources to lessen their suffering in a kind and cheerful manner.	
<b>K</b>	<b>Shepherding (Eph 4:11)</b> – Those who have this gift have the Spirit-given capacity and desire to serve God by overseeing, training, and caring for the needs of a group of Christians. This often involves a desire to teach the Word of God, leader others, and show compassion for those they oversee.	
<b>L</b>	<b>Service (also called ‘Helps’) (Rom 12:7; 1 Cor 12:28)</b> – Those with the gift of service or helps are those who can aid or render assistance to others in the church with compassion and a willing heart. They are often the first to volunteer to help in non-glamorous ways. This gift has a broad range of possibilities for application.	
<b>M</b>	<b>Teaching (Rom 12:7; 1 Cor 12:28,29; Eph 4:11)</b> – This gift involves the study and proclamation of the Word of God, explaining the meaning, context and application to the hearer’s life. It involves skilled communication & passion for God’s Word.	
<b>N</b>	<b>(Word of) Wisdom (1 Cor 12:8)</b> – This gift describes someone who can understand and speak forth biblical truth in such a way as to wisely apply it to life situations with all discernment.
