Note: Individuals can call D.W.M.H.A. (Detroit Wayne Mental Health Authority) and let them know when they call that they are seeking opioid addiction services. They should be very honest about their use and that they would like to engage in services immediately. If they require detox they should make sure they let the call person know. If they are not honest about their use they may not qualify. Ex: individuals call us because they have been referred for detox and in-patient by a judge or PO, etc. They are afraid of being violated if they're honest or they are just ashamed of their use (understandable) so they say they haven't used in three weeks. They won't qualify because they are not in active use or addiction.
