Apostles' Creed

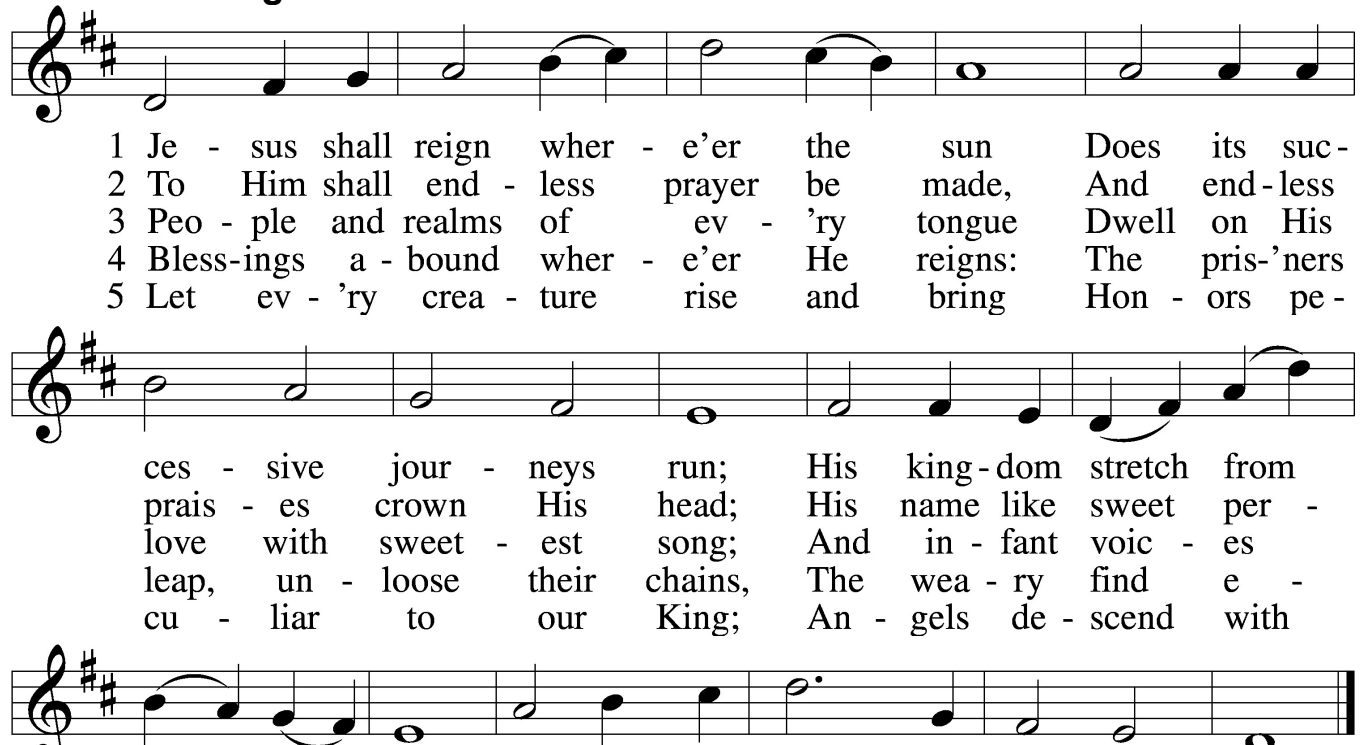
C I believe in God, the Father Almighty,

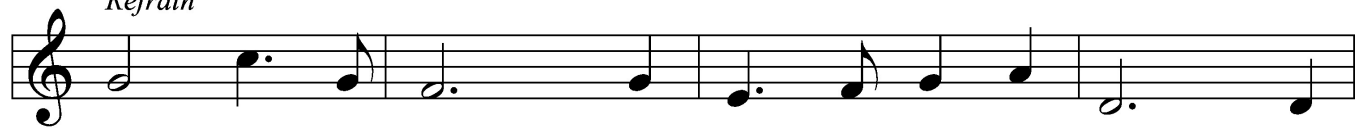
