



FOREFRONT SMALL GROUP STUDY

Circles > Rows is a short series that explores how the Gospel doesn't just gather us for worship—it shapes us through community. While Sunday services matter, real transformation happens when we move from sitting in rows to living life in circles. Through Scripture and shared stories, this series invites us to step out of isolation, discover new perspectives of Jesus through one another, and experience the kind of belonging we were designed for.

Icebreaker Question:

What's something you've talked about doing for a long time—but still haven't actually done yet?

DAILY WALK / NEXT STEP:

Do one thing together.

As a group, identify one real need—big or small—and meet it this week or this month. Don't over-plan it. Pick something tangible, commit to it, and move together. Let compassion become the fruit of your community.

GROUP STUDY:

**James 2:14-17; 1 John 3:16-18;
Matthew 25:35-40**

1. When you hear the phrase “faith in action,” what comes to mind? What do you think it looks like in real life?
2. Why do you think it’s easier to talk about helping people than to actually help them? What usually gets in the way?
3. What’s the difference between feeling compassion and living compassion? How can you tell when compassion has become action?
4. Who are the people in our world that are easiest to overlook? (In your neighborhood, workplace, school, or even your own family.)
5. Have you ever been on the receiving end of someone’s practical help at the right time? What did it mean to you?
6. What do you think happens to a community when they serve together regularly? How does it change relationships, trust, and purpose?
7. If our group wanted to take one simple step toward serving this month, what’s a realistic way to start? What’s something we could actually do—not just talk about?
