2. Why do you think many people feel intimidated by the idea of helping others grow spiritually?
3. The message described discipleship as helping someone take their "next step." Why is that a helpful way to think about spiritual growth?
4. Have you ever experienced a conversation, invitation, or encouragement that changed the direction of your life? What happened?
5. What qualities from Colossians 3 (compassion, kindness, humility, patience, forgiveness, love) do you think make the greatest impact on those around us?
6. Who might God be bringing to your mind right now as someone you could pray for, invest in, or invite?
7. If every Christian focused on helping just one person take a next step with Jesus, how do you think that would change families, churches, and communities?
