Read: Deuteronomy 6:4–9

1. Who has been one of the most influential people in your life, and what made their influence so significant?
 2. The message emphasized that influence begins with surrender, not strategy. What do you think that means in practical terms?
 3. What are some everyday rhythms or habits that have shaped who you are today—for better or worse?
 4. Why do you think people are often more impacted by what we consistently do than by what we occasionally say?
 5. Have you ever experienced the ripple effect of someone else's kindness, faith, or encouragement years later? Share that story.
 6. Moses instructed God's people to talk about their faith while sitting, walking, lying down, and getting up. What might that look like in today's culture?
 7. If someone closely observed your priorities, schedule, and decisions for a month, what would they conclude matters most to you?
