

GOOD FRIDAY TENEBRAE SERVICE

Tonight's service is an adaptation of the ancient office of Tenebrae (a Latin word meaning darkness or shadows.) Tenebrae is intended to impress upon the minds and hearts of believers the tragic consequences of our sins and the greatness of Jesus' sacrifice on Calvary. Traditionally, the ceremony of Tenebrae embodies the extinguishing of candles and other lights in the church,



the casting the entire sanctuary into total darkness. This is a reminder of the darkness that fell over the earth as the Son of God was crucified. It is also symbolic of the gradual flight and denial of the disciples and friends of Jesus.

As we see the service unfolding, we are graphically reminded of our own desertion of Jesus and the consequence of separation. The extinguishing of the final candle signifies the death of Jesus. The harsh sound (called the STREPITUS in Latin) is symbolic of the closing of the door to the tomb after the burial of Jesus. It also warns us of the imminent termination of our own life. Amid the darkness of Good Friday there is the promise of resurrection. The single candlestick is called the Christ candle and represents Jesus as the Light of the World. It is restored at the close of the service as a sign that the darkness will not triumph. Christ is victorious.






