
Do you have a prayer request?

Bethel is on a mission...to donate UMCOR Health Kits for Annual Conference!

If you would like to donate, items needed are:

One bath hand towel (15 x 25 –17 x 27 inches)
 (No kitchen/cleaning/microfiber towels)

One bath washcloth

(No kitchen/cleaning/microfiber towels)

One comb

(Must be sturdy with at least 6 inches of teeth. No pocket combs or picks. Rattail and combs without handles are acceptable but must have at least 6 inches of teeth.)

• One toenail or fingernail clipper

(No emery boards or metal nail files.)

Bath-size soap (3 oz. bar or larger)

(No Ivory or Jergen's soap. Do not remove from packaging.)

One adult toothbrush

(Do not remove from packaging. No personal advertising.)

• 10 adhesive bandages (¾ by 3 inches)

(Common household bandages acceptable.)

You can donate a complete kit(s), individual items (like 10 bars of soap), **OR** you can make a donation to cover shipping costs (\$1 per kit), donate for toothpaste they will purchase in bulk (\$1 per kit) that will be added to our kits by UMCOR, or I can shop to purchase the supplies needed to make complete kits. Just put your donation in an envelope and mark "Kits for Conference" under "other" on donation envelope.

Please bring all donations, for the kits, to church by June 8th...there is a collection bin in the narthex. Thank you for sharing God's love with our neighbors, near and far! ©



If you would like to donate food items: (donate by June 2nd):

Canned meats (canned tuna or chicken, ravioli, canned soups with meat, spam, Vienna sausages, sardines); canned tomatoes; pasta; pasta sauce; cereal; oatmeal; peanut butter; jelly; canned fruit; canned veggies; dry beans (pinto, black eye peas, lima, navy, black beans, kidney beans); condiments; coffee; tea; juice; granola bars; cereal bars; fruit snacks; sugar; flour; single size cereal; oatmeal in a cup; Roman noodles; crackers; mac/cheese in cups; &/or fruit cups.

Other items needed (donate by June 8th):

Cleaning supplies, hygiene products (sanitary napkins/shampoo/ conditioner/body soap/deodorant/TP), and diapers (all sizes)

There is a shopping cart in the narthex for your food donations.
