THE CALL TO BE A FATHER

This past weekend, at Mission of Hope, we had "Visitation Sunday." It is a time when men visit with their families. As visitation reached its final moments, a young child no more than five or six began to cry and beg to stay with his father. This episode caused a familiar knot in my stomach like it has so many times before. Ironically, for the last few weeks the Lord has provided me teaching opportunities and counseling, focusing around this very subject matter. It is no coincidence that many of the men here, past and present, have grown up with absentee fathers; only to find themselves in a vicious cycle. How can we change this?

There is "good news!" As a blood bought, born again, believer in Jesus Christ and the One who sent Him, and a father of two myself; the call to be a father must be rooted in the Word of God! Ephesians 6: 4 says, "And you, fathers, do not provoke your children to wrath, but bring them up in the training and admonition of the Lord." The Apostle Paul is talking to – "FATHERS". It's not that he is saying that the mother is void of the infraction... but it's technically referring to the male parent. I myself want to be the first to confess and repent of my failure. So men of God, I encourage you this Christmas season; Let's begin today and make a new covenant with God to be Fathers called by God. Let's give away the legacy of faith to our children and let this be the greatest gift we can give, not just this Christmas, but every day. Praise God for the fathers that are fighting the good fight and are already at work in their homes!!

**Footnote – According to the U.S. Census Bureau of 2017 statistics; 19.7 million children, more than 1 in 4, live without a father in the home. Consequently, there is a father factor in nearly all social ills facing America today. This; my friends is a greater pandemic in this world than any virus. This is a virus of the soul which increases the number of dads, while diminishing the need for fathers.

The Testimony of Brian Thomas



Growing up I had a normal, great childhood. Had God loving, God fearing parents. From childhood to early adulthood I was highly involved in the local church in Missouri. I was a member of a traveling praise group. Even though I was very much involved in the church, I dealt with depression, and suicide was becoming the solution. When I hit my early twenties, I began to dabble in the bar scene. I thought with alcohol, this would be an easier way to achieve confidence and happiness. When I drank alcohol, I thought I wasn't sad. But little did I know that alcohol would lead me to smoking cigarettes. By the age of twenty seven I was in a bad cocaine addiction, which led to multiple years of meth amphetamine abuse. A drug that fueled my depression. Suicide was no longer a thought, but an action, and during my addiction I tried multiple times to harm myself, degrade myself in the effort to take my own life. This mind set placed me in the Psych Ward twice and in three rehab facilities prior to coming to Mission of Hope. Before Mission of Hope the word that described me best was "Defeated!" I was finished with life. Being defeated pushed me to seek help. I worked for a man that was a missionary at Mission of Hope as a sister church in Missouri. He told me about Mission of Hope and God met me where I was in my addiction and therefore called me to Mission of Hope. On July 17, 2019 I arrived for the three month program. On July 27, 2019 I realized my need for the Savior and gave my heart to Jesus Christ after working with a local minister. Towards the end of my program I had a loving family help me decide that I was not ready to leave and needed some more time. Looking back I truly believe that in most cases three months is not enough. Thus, God called me to the twelve month Step Up program. In 1Peter 5: 10 it says, "But the God of all grace, who hath called us unto his eternal glory by Christ Jesus, after that ye have suffered a while, make you perfect, establish, strengthen, and settle you." It was in that year that I was able to endure trials and test that would strengthen my walk. Today I no longer live with depression; because I serve a God that says in Philippians 4: 6;

"Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your request be made known to God..." God gives me the tools to conquer these areas in my life. Today I want to live! Because I serve a God that says in verse 7; I will have, "the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus." God gives me peace and guards my heart and mind, when I operate in verse 6.

After completing the Step Up program, the Lord

After completing the Step Up program, the Lord blessed me with a Staff Intern Maintenance position in conjunction with a local sister church in Mobile. I am so grateful to be delivered from depression, addiction and now a part of Mission of Hope Ministries.


MIRACLE ON DAUPHIN STREET
