Statics from above video:

#### World population

- 33% "Christian" (World C)
  - not all true believers in Christ
  - may be nominal
  - may self-identify as Christian because everyone else does
- 38% have access to the gospel but have chosen not to follow Jesus (World B)
  - Bibles in their language
  - Churches nearby
  - Friends or coworkers potentially believers
  - Access to other Christian resources
- 29% have never heard of Jesus (World A)
  - No access to the gospel
  - No Bibles
  - No churches
  - No believers nearby

#### Missionaries (Cross-Cultural Workers)

- 1 out of every 1,800 "Christians" (from World C) serves as a cross-cultural missionary
  - 72% serve in *World C* (where people already self-identify as Christians)
  - 25% serve in *World B* (where there is already some access to the gospel)
  - 3% serve in *World A* (where there is no access to the gospel)

#### Money

- \$42 trillion -- annual income of all Christians (from World C)
  - o \$700 billion (2% of Christian income) -- given to *any* Christian cause

- \$45 billion (6.4% of all giving) -- given to missions
  - \$39 billion (87%) -- given to missions in *World C* (where people already self-identify as Christians)
  - \$5.4 billion (12%) -- given to missions in *World B* (where there is already some access to the gospel)
  - **\$450 million (1%)** -- given to missions in *World A* (where there is no access to the gospel)
    - Americans spend more each year on Halloween costumes for their pets
    - **0.06%** of all Christian giving going to missions in *World A*
    - **0.001%** of all Christian income going to missions in *World A*

Read the following questions about Cross-Cultural work and discuss the answers as a group.

#### 1) What is our definition of "missions" at COBC?

- Leaders Cheat:
  - o **Evangelism** sharing the gospel with anyone anywhere.
  - o **Missions** doing the work of an evangelist but in a different culture.
    - Usually involves learning a language (often 2 languages) and learning a culture for the sake of the gospel. Missions usually happen in a culture that has no church in which people are doing evangelism, therefore they have no access to the gospel unless we (Christians from a different culture) go.
  - Missionaries people who cross a cultural boundary for the sake of the gospel and are planting a church. They go to reach unreached people groups (UPGs).
    - Why might it be helpful to separate the terms "Evangelism" and "Missions" as two different things?

# 2) Why do we call our missionaries <u>Cross-Cultural Workers</u>?

- Leaders cheat:
  - o 2 reasons:

- **First** Because so many pastors have preached that "we are all missionaries", using the term "*Cross-Cultural Workers*" brings clarity to what we are saying as a church.
  - Men & women crossing a cultural boundary to share the gospel.
- Second the words "missions & missionary" are dangerous words for most of our Cross-Cultural Workers.

- Leaders Cheat:
  - o "Supporting" a missionary
    - We give money & encouragement
  - "Sending" a missionary means we are sending someone we consider part of our church.
    - We are committing to be responsible for that missionary, for both the care and for making sure they are preaching and teaching the gospel with clarity and accuracy.

#### • Leaders Cheat:

- Reaching the unreached people groups (UPG's) of World A.
  - There are many great ministries working with Worlds C & B, but Country Oaks has made it our focus to reach the people considered "unreached" from World A.

#### • Leaders Cheat:

- o The 29% of the world that has never heard of Jesus (World A)
  - No access to the gospel
  - No Bibles
  - No churches
  - No believers nearby
