4 Points of Sunday's Sermon

I. Israel's Problem

- Read and discuss Exodus 18:13-18
- Why do you think Jethro was concerned for Moses and Israel? What does he specifically say in verse 17 and 18?
- Discuss Moses' response to Jethro in Exodus 18:15-16. Do you think Moses was blinded to the problem Jethro saw so clearly? If so, why?
- Why is it that others can sometimes see our faults (or blind spots) more clearly than ourselves? Do you invite others to speak into your life, and if so, how?
- What does Proverbs 4:7 mean and what are some practical ways you can live by it?
- What do you think James 1:5 means? What are some ways God gives wisdom generously?

II. Jethro's Advice

- According to Jethro in verse 19 & 20, what were Moses' two most important jobs?
 - Leader's cheat: Prayer (v. 19) and Teaching (v.20)
- In light of verses 19 & 20, why do you think Jethro was so concerned for Moses and Israel? What was his practical advice in verses 21 & 22?
- Compare Jethro's advice in Exodus 18:19-22 to Acts 6:1-4. What do we learn in both?
- What does Exodus 18:19-22 and Acts 6:1-4 teach us about the importance of teaching and prayer?
- Why is teaching and prayer so important for the leadership of the Church?
- Do you believe the average American church sees teaching and praying as a high priority? Why or why not?

III. Jethro's Wisdom

- What was so wise about Jethro's advice given in Exodus 18:19-22?
- How is our government set up in a similar way to the advice Jethro gave to Moses? Do you think Exodus 18 had some influence on our founding fathers?
- In verse 21, Jethro advises Moses to pick men who are qualified. What 4 qualifications
 does Jethro suggest, and why would these qualifications be important for the leaders of
 Israel?
- **Read Titus 1:5-9** and discuss the qualifications of an elder. Compare and contrast the qualifications in Titus 1:5-9 with the qualifications found in Exodus 18:21.
- Even if you are not called to fulltime ministry and/or the office of overseer, what are some practical ways you can strive to be a man or a women characterized by the list mentioned in Titus 1:5-9 and Exodus 18:21?

VI. Moses' Humility

- Read and discuss the following verses concerning wisdom.
 - o Proverbs 13:1
 - o Ephesians 6:1-3
 - o Proverbs 16:16
 - o Job 12:12
- Do you personally seek out wisdom? If so, how?
- In what ways could Moses have been tempted to be prideful?
- In what way is verse 24 simple, yet remarkable? Read Numbers 12:3 to help answer this question.
- **Discuss the following quote,** "You have to be humble enough to realize you need wisdom, to gain wisdom." How does James 1:5 and Proverbs 4:7 relate to this quote?
- **Read and discuss** Proverbs 12:15. If you are critical by nature, and always seem to be the one who is "right" in your own heart, according to this proverb, what most likely are you?
- What are some practical ways we can protect ourselves from being the fool talked about in Proverbs 12:15?
