

Daily Devotional for RESET YOUR FAITH

Here is a Daily Devotional to enable you to make the most out of this sermon. You may use it for your personal growth or discuss it together in your Life Group.

NOV. 22 | Day One: Have Faith In God!

What spoke to you the most in the sermon “RESET YOUR FAITH”? How can the truth from this sermon change your life?

Read Matthew 14:22-33. What life lessons can you learn from this story? Are you more like Peter or more like the disciples that stayed in the boat? Why?

Pastor Whitcomb said, “Just because a situation is difficult doesn’t mean you’re not in the will of God. The disciples were in God’s will and going God’s way, but they still faced a storm.” What does this statement mean to you? Have you ever wondered if you had missed the will of God because of the opposition you faced? How can the truth from this sermon give you the courage you need to persevere in the storm?

READ this Scripture out loud: Mark 11:22-23 “Jesus said to the disciples, ‘Have faith in God. I tell you the truth, you can say to this mountain, ‘May you be lifted up and thrown into the sea,’ and it will happen. But you must really believe it will happen and have no doubt in your heart.’”

MAKE this faith declaration out loud: “I declare that I have faith in God! My faith is strong and getting stronger. Miracles are my portion as I speak my faith today.”

PRAY this prayer by faith: “Lord, build my faith! Let every good thing that You desire for me come to pass in my life as I reset my faith according to Your Word. In Jesus’ Name, Amen!”

NOV. 23 | Day Two: God is Keeping You by Faith.

Pastor Whitcomb taught us, “You may be in a storm, but the storm doesn’t need to be in you! Don’t allow outward circumstances to determine your inner peace. God will keep you in the storm when you stay in faith.” What does this statement mean to you?

Read 1 Peter 1:1-5NLT. List one promise, one encouraging fact, and one new perspective you see in this passage. What does the Apostle Peter mean when he calls us, “God’s chosen people who are living as foreigners” in verse one?

Sometimes the storm we face is outside of us, in our circumstances. Sometimes the storm we face is inside of us, in our hearts and minds. Where are you facing your greatest storm today? How can what you heard in this message encourage you through the storm?

READ this Scripture out loud: 1 Peter 1:5 “Through your faith, God is protecting you by his power until you receive this salvation, which is ready to be revealed on the last day for all to see.”

MAKE this faith declaration out loud: “I am protected by God’s power. My faith is a shield that quenches every fiery dart of the enemy. No weapon formed against me shall prosper because my trust is in God.”

PRAY this prayer by faith: “Thank you, Lord, for saving me! It’s not by good works but by your grace that I am saved. I reset my faith to align with your will today. I am saved now and I will be saved at the last day. Make my life a witness of your grace to the world!”

NOV. 24 | Day Three: Tested Faith = Trusted Faith.

Pastor Whitcomb said, “Fire forges fiery faith. Deep valleys develop deep faith. In order to get a faith that can be trusted, you have to have a faith that has been tested.” What does this statement mean to you? How does this truth put your current difficulties in context?

Read 1 Peter 1:6-12. What truth stands out to you the most in this passage?

What is the biggest test of faith you have ever experienced? In what ways did passing through that test actually make your faith stronger?

READ this Scripture out loud: 1 Peter 1:7 “These trials will show that your faith is genuine. It is being tested as fire tests and purifies gold - though your faith is far more precious than mere gold. So when your faith remains strong through many trials, it will bring you much praise and glory and honor on the day when Jesus Christ is revealed to the whole world.”

MAKE this faith declaration out loud: “My faith has been tested so my faith can be trusted. Every fiery trial is forging fiery faith in me. Every deep valley is developing deep faith in me. I am strong. My faith is more precious than gold. God is rewarding me for my faith. God is honoring my faith.”

PRAY this prayer aloud: “Father, purify my faith and make it stronger and more precious than gold. Let every good and perfect blessing come into my life in Jesus’ Name. Amen!”

NOV. 25 | Day Four: Fight the Good Fight of Faith.

Pastor Whitcomb said, “The storm didn’t come to sink you. The storm came to strengthen you.” What does this statement mean to you? Think of a time in your life when difficulty actually made you more determined. What can you learn from that experience?

Read 1 Timothy 6:11-16. What stood out to you in today’s scripture reading?

The storms of this life are only temporary. Eternity is ahead when we will enjoy the fulfillment of all the promises of God. Stay focused on your future with Christ and rejoice that He has promised to wipe away every tear and give you rest, peace, and joy forever.

READ this Scripture out loud: 1 Timothy 6:12 “Fight the good fight for the true faith. Hold tightly to the eternal life to which God has called you.”

MAKE this faith declaration out loud: “I am fighting the good fight of faith. I am holding

tightly to eternal life. The storm didn't come to sink me. The storm came to strengthen me. God has called me and I am following His call on my life."

PRAY these words by faith: "Father God, Let Your Kingdom come into my heart and life as I reset my faith. Let Your will be done in my entire life. Let Your name be glorified in me."

NOV. 26 | Day Five: Courage!

Read Hebrews 6:10-20. What stood out to you in today's scripture reading? What do these verses teach us about the combination of faith and patience?

Pastor Whitcomb said, "Courage comes from Jesus' authority not my ability. Since He has all authority, I can have courage in every situation I face." What does this statement mean to you?

Are you a courageous person? On a scale of 1 to 10, with 10 being very courageous and 1 being very fearful, what number would you give to your life? Are you more courageous in some areas of your life than others? Which part of your life do you display the greatest courage and which part of your life do you show the least courage? How can you apply the authority of Jesus to the areas of your life where you need more courage?

READ this Scripture out loud: Hebrews 6:11-12 "We want each of you to show this same diligence to the very end, so that what you hope for may be fully realized. Imitate those who through faith and patience inherit what has been promised."

MAKE this faith declaration out loud: "I am courageous because Jesus has authority over every situation. I am courageous because His authority results in my ability. I will not quit. I will not relent. I am imitating Jesus."

PRAY these words by faith: "Lord, Your promises are so great. You have promised me an inheritance and I ask you to guide me and provide for me that I may be diligent to the end and realize what you've promised to me."

NOV. 27 | Day Six: Don't Quit!

Pastor Whitcomb said, "If Jesus put it on you, He will put the strength in you. If Jesus calls you, He will carry you. If He said, 'Do it!' then He's got a way for you to do it!" What does this statement mean to you?

One of the most common ways people quit is by compromising. We fail to complete our journey for Christ because we allow compromise to creep into our lives. Rather than maintaining a standard of excellence, we often do an inferior job. Does this describe you? Are you compromising in any area of your speech, your thoughts, or your actions? Reset your life now to align with God's Word.

Read Philippians 1:3-11. What speaks to you the most in this passage?

READ this Scripture out loud: Philippians 1:6 "God is the one who began this good work in you, and I am certain that he won't stop before it is complete on the day that Christ Jesus returns."
