

- Expect God to speed up what He has promised in this new season. Pray and thank Him for supernatural acceleration. Declare delays broken by the power of the Holy Spirit. God's promises to you are coming swiftly in the name of Jesus. Amen.**

Read Isaiah 41:18 out loud: “I will make rivers flow on barren heights, and springs within the valleys.”

- How does Isaiah 41:18 reveal God's power to transform barrenness? Where have you seen God turn dry places into fruitful ones?
- What does it mean for you to trust His rivers today?
- How can you shift your focus from dryness to God's promise?

God specializes in bringing life to barren places. What looks impossible to man is easy for God. Personalize Isaiah 41:18 and declare: “God will make rivers flow on every barren heights in my life and He will cause springs to flourish every valley around me.”

Read Philippians 1:6.

- What does it mean to walk “sealed” in a new season?
- What “good work” has God already begun in you?
- Where do you need to stop doubting God’s ability to finish? How will you live differently knowing God has it under control?

Pray this prayer in faith: “Lord, thank You for sealing this season with Your faithfulness. I walk forward in confidence, knowing every road and river You open will be sustained by Your power. Amen.”

Daily Devotional

Here is a Daily Devotional to enable you to make the most out of this sermon. You may use it for your personal growth or discuss it together in your Life Group.

September 1: The God of the New.

Read Isaiah 43:19.

- What “old season” do you sense God moving you out of? How does Isaiah 43:19 challenge your vision of the future?
- What new thing do you believe God is birthing in your life? What keeps you clinging to the old instead of stepping into the new?
- How can you practically position yourself to receive God’s “new roads and rivers”?

Make this declaration in faith: “I embrace the God of the new. I will walk in every fresh road He opens and drink from every river He provides.”

September 2: Crossing into a New Season.

Read Joshua 3:15–16.

- Every new season requires a step of faith. Israel crossed the Jordan when their priests dared to step into the overflowing waters. What “Jordan River” is standing in front of you right now?
- Where do you sense God asking you to step even before you see results? How does obedience prepare the way for breakthrough?
- What fears must you overcome to step forward? How can this passage encourage your faith this week?

Pray this prayer in faith: “Lord Jesus, give me bold faith to step where You call me, even when the way looks impossible. Make a way where there seems to be no way. Amen.”

September 3: Rivers of Joy.

Read Psalm 46:4.

- Where do you feel “dry” and in need of God’s refreshing? How do God’s rivers bring gladness even in crisis?
- What does this verse teach about God’s presence with His people?
- In what ways has God been your source in hard times? How can you remain connected to His river daily?

Thank God for the rivers of joy He is bringing into your situation. Ask God to refresh your spirit. Pray that your strength will be renewed. Pray that your heart will be filled with gladness in God’s presence.

September 4: Breaking Fear and Hesitation.

Read 2 Timothy 1:7.

- Fear and hesitation are roadblocks to new beginnings. God never calls us to move in fear but in bold faith. Where is fear holding you back from obeying God?
- What does 2 Timothy 1:7 reveal about your true identity in Christ? How has hesitation delayed your progress in the past?
- What step of faith are you resisting right now? What would it look like to move boldly in power, love, and sound judgment?

Make this declaration in faith: “I reject fear and hesitation. I walk in God’s power, love, and sound mind into every new road.”

September 5: Supernatural Acceleration.

Read Amos 9:13.

- When God releases supernatural acceleration, delays are broken and breakthroughs come quickly. What normally takes years can happen in days when God is moving. Where have you experienced delays that need God’s acceleration?
- How does Amos 9:13 stretch your faith for this season? What promise are you asking God to accelerate in your life?
