

September 20: Serving with Sacrifice.

Read 1 Corinthians 9:22-23.

- Missions requires humility and sacrifice. Paul became all things to all people so that some might be saved. What does it mean to “become all things to all people”? How are you challenged to serve others in humility?
- Rev. Divine stated last weekend, “**Missions Demands Sacrifice - But Builds Eternal Legacy.**” Why is sacrifice important in missions? How can you make the Gospel relatable to those around you?
- What legacy do you want to leave behind in missions?

Make this declaration in faith: “I choose to serve with humility and to sacrifice for the mission of Christ. Jesus is my example to serve. The Apostle Paul is my example. Pastor Whitcomb is my example. I imitate those who sacrifice all for the Lord’s work.”

September 21: Here Am I, Send Me.

Read Isaiah 6:8.

- What does Isaiah’s response teach us about availability for missions? What holds people back from saying, “Here am I, send me”?
- How do you sense God calling you to respond in missions?
- The mission of God always requires a willing response. In what ways can you actively live sent this week? How will you keep your heart ready for God’s call?

Pray this prayer out loud: “Lord Jesus, I hear Your call today. Here am I Lord! Please send me to love, to serve, and to carry Your mission forward from Agape House Ghana to the rest of the world. Amen.”



Daily Devotional BORN FOR MISSIONS

Here is a Daily Devotional to enable you to make the most out of this sermon. You may use it for your personal growth or discuss it together in your Life Group.

September 15: Born for Missions.

Read John 3:16.

- What spoke to you the most from the sermon this weekend? What does John 3:16 reveal about God’s motivation for missions? How does God’s love challenge your personal priorities?
- God’s mission begins with love. From the beginning, He has been reaching out to the world with a plan of salvation. Who in your life still needs to hear about Jesus? How does knowing God’s heart for the world change your view of missions?
- What step can you take this week to reflect God’s love?

Pray this prayer in faith: “Heavenly Father, thank You for loving the world so deeply. Help me to carry Your heart for people and to live with a mission mindset every day. Help me to join other believers in Agape House to reach the lost. I ask this in Jesus’ name. Amen.”

September 16: Sent with a Purpose.

Read John 20:21-22.

- What does it mean to be sent like Jesus? How does the Holy Spirit equip you for missions?

- Why is peace important in fulfilling God's mission? What area of your life has God been prompting you to surrender for His mission especially in Agape House?
- Rev. Divine stated, "**Missions is our spiritual identity. We're saved to be sent.**" How can you live with a greater sense of being sent each day?

Make this declaration out loud: "I am sent by Jesus and equipped by the Spirit for God's mission. Missions is part of my identity as a disciple. I will faithfully commit to missions with boldness and effectiveness."

***September 17: Witnesses in Every Place.
Read Acts 1:8.***

- Where is your "Jerusalem" - the place where you are called to witness right now? How can you begin to look beyond your comfort zone to reach others?
- What role does the Holy Spirit play in effective witnessing? Who can you partner with in mission work?
- How does this verse challenge your view of global missions? Remember: Every believer is empowered by the Spirit to carry the Gospel everywhere. God calls us to be His witnesses, starting where we are and extending to the ends of the earth. How are you fulfilling this call in your family, church, and community?

Pray and thank God for Agape House and the Missions ministry. Thank God for the life of Rev. Whitcomb and missionaries who have left the comfort of their home countries and are propagating the Gospel. Thank God for witnesses everywhere.

***September 18: Missions Is Love in Action.
Read Matthew 25:35-36.***

- What do these verses reveal about the link between love and missions?
- Rev. Divine shared with us, "**Missions is not only about what we say but what we do. Missions is not just about what people hear but how we make them feel.**" How can you better reflect God's love through actions this week?
- Who around you needs practical love right now? Why is serving others a powerful witness of the gospel? How can our church grow in showing Christ's love to the community?

Ask Jesus to empower you to love like He does. Pray for the strength to love with heart of Christ. Pray that your life will become a testament for the people around you to look to God. Make this declaration: "Missions is love in action. I will serve and care for others as I serve the Lord."

***September 19: Love That Overflows.
Read Romans 5:5.***

- Without His love, our efforts become empty; with His love, we become vessels of healing and hope. Missions is not just what we say but how people experience Christ through us. How does the Holy Spirit fill your heart with God's love? Why is love essential for effective missions?
- Rev. Divine said, "**Missions is love that walks, weeps, and works.**" How does love transform the way you treat people who are different from you?
- When have you felt God's love overflow from you to others? How can you cultivate a greater sensitivity to the Spirit's leading in love?

Pray this prayer in faith: "Holy Spirit, fill my heart with God's love until it overflows to everyone I meet. Let me be a conduit of love for your kingdom in Jesus' name. Amen."
