



DAILY DEVOTIONAL: DESTINY PRAYER

Here is a Daily Devotional to enable you to make the most out of this sermon. You may use it for your personal growth or in your Life Group.

January 12: Align with God's Purpose

Read 1 Chronicles 4:9–10.

- What spoke to you the most from the sermon “**DESTINY PRAYER**”? How will what you heard influence you this year?
- Jabez was given his name because he was born in pain. Where has your history (pain, labels, family narratives) been quietly scripting your expectations for the future?
- When you pray for blessing, what

outcome are you really chasing: God's will, people's approval, or relief from pressure? Be honest.

- Which request in Jabez's prayer feels hardest for you to ask without shame (blessing, enlargement, God's hand, or protection)? Why?

Tell God you trust His purposes. Release any labels or limitations you've accepted. Ask for divine help in one decision today. Ask Him boldly: "Lord, bless me indeed with what advances Your will."

January 13: Blessed Indeed

Read Proverbs 10:22.

- What would you call "success" if nobody clapped for you, and nobody knew about it?

- Where have you been tempted to pursue a blessing by shortcut, compromise, or burnout? What has it already cost you?
- Proverbs says God's blessing adds no sorrow to it. Identify one "sorrow" (stress, guilt, fear, conflict) attached to your striving.
- If God blessed you "indeed" this year, what new responsibility would you need the maturity to carry? What boundary do you need to set so that your blessings remain peaceful and holy?

Make this faith declaration out loud: "The blessing of the Lord is making me rich, and He adds no sorrow with it. I reject counterfeit success and receive God's peace with God's provision."

January 14: Influence – Destiny is Impact

Read and meditate on Matthew 5:13-16.

- Rev. Divine said, “**Destiny is not just about personal fulfillment - it’s about impact.**” In your environment, what would it look like for your presence to preserve what is good (salt) rather than blend in?
- Where have you become “numb” – not by major sin, but by silence, fear, people-pleasing, or inconsistency?
- Who is being shaped by your example more than you realize? What are they learning from the way you live?

- If your light shone fully, what specific good work would become visible this week?
- Destiny is not just personal fulfillment – it’s impact. Who is meant to be helped through your obedience?

Ask God to make your life useful and courageous. Confess where you’ve hidden or diluted your witness. Pray for one person or group God wants to reach through you. Ask for one clear “good work” assignment today.

January 15: Expand Capacity

Read Isaiah 54:2–3.

- Rev. Divine shared with us, **“Destiny Prayer shatters boundaries and expands grace.”** What does this statement mean to you?

- When you ask God to enlarge your territory, what are you actually asking for: visibility, responsibility, people, resources, or capacity?
- Where are you doing growth halfway (discipline, skill, leadership, prayer, giving)? What hidden weakness could collapse your expansion if you don't address it now?
- If God expands you, what must change first: your schedule, your relationships, or your mindset? What fear rises when you imagine bigger territory – failure, exposure, success, or being overwhelmed?

Make this faith declaration out loud: “Lord, enlarge my territory and expand my capacity. I will stretch, strengthen, and prepare for growth without fear.”

January 16: Boundaries Shattered, Grace Expanded

Read Psalm 18:19.

- Where do you feel “cramped” right now – limited by fear, resources, access, confidence, or patterns?
- God delivered David because God delighted in David. How do relate to God – as delighted Father or disappointed judge?
- Which boundary is more stubborn: external resistance or internal unbelief? What proves it?
- What step would you take this week if you were convinced God delights in you?

Receive God's delight – not performance-based acceptance. Name

the boundary; invite God's power into it. Ask for expanded grace: courage, provision, healing, strength. Pray for humility as God enlarges your life. Ask for one specific obedience step this week.

January 17: God's Hand is with You

Read Luke 12:16–21.

- Last weekend, Rev. Divine said, **“Destiny shifts when prayer moves from ‘God doing for us’ to ‘God doing through us’”**. What does this statement mean to you?
- The rich man planned bigger barns but not a richer soul. Where are you building “barns” while neglecting intimacy with God?

- What would it mean for you to be “rich toward God” in this season practically? Where do you need God’s presence to truly enjoy what He has given you?
- Which would you rather have: more with anxiety, or enough with God’s hand? What does your lifestyle show? If God’s hand were clearly with you today, what decision would become simpler?

Invite God’s presence (not just outcomes). Ask God to reorder priorities and expose what crowds Him out. Pray to be rich toward God (generosity, obedience, eternal focus). Ask for grace to enjoy God’s gifts without idolatry.

January 18: Kept from Evil, Made a Blessing

Read Genesis 12:2.

- Rev. Divine said, “**The richest blessings are wrapped in gifts and rooted in presence.**” What does this statement mean to you?
- Jabez asked to be kept from evil that he may not cause pain. What pattern in you could injure others if God doesn’t purify and restrain it?
- Where are you most vulnerable to subtle evil – pride, compromise, bitterness, shortcuts, unhealthy relationships?
- Who is affected if you refuse your calling – who loses out? How can your blessing point people to God instead of pointing back to you?

- If God truly blesses and keeps you, what obedience are you now willing to take?

Make this faith declaration out loud: “God is blessing me and keeping me. He preserves me from evil, purifies my heart, and makes me a blessing to many.”
