



DAILY DEVOTIONAL: YOUR GLORIOUS DESTINY

Here is a Daily Devotional to enable you to make the most out of this sermon. You may use it for your personal growth or in your Life Group.

January 5: Guided into Glory

Read Psalm 73:24-28.

- What spoke to you the most from the sermon “**YOUR GLORIOUS DESTINY**”? How will what you heard influence you this year?
- Where do you need God’s counsel most right now? What decision have you been making without involving God?
- What does “glorious destiny” mean for your life this year? What

distractions have been drowning out God's guidance?

- What is one obedient step you can take today?

Make this faith declaration out loud: “This year, God is guiding me with His counsel. He is leading me into a glorious destiny.”

January 6: God's Masterpiece, God's Plan

Read Ephesians 2:10 and Psalm 139:13-14.

- Where have you been undervaluing yourself?
- What “good works” might God be calling you to focus on now?

- Who are you trying to impress instead of pleasing God?
- Where do you need to stop comparing and start obeying?
- What gift or ability in you needs to be developed, not hidden?

Make this faith declaration out loud: “I am God’s masterpiece, created for His purpose and His plan. This year, I will live out this truth for His glory.”

Pray this prayer by faith: “Father, thank You for creating me with purpose. Help me walk boldly in what You planned for me. Silence every voice that says I’m not enough. In Jesus’ name I pray. Amen.”

January 7: See from God's Point of View

Read and meditate on 1 Corinthians 4:6.

- Pastor Whitcomb said, **“God has a glorious destiny for YOU. It’s His plan and His purpose and His priority to lead you to a glorious destiny.”** What situation are you viewing only through emotion, fear, or pressure?
- If you saw your life from God’s point of view, what would change? What truth from God do you need to accept even if you don’t feel it?
- What perspective shift would bring peace to your heart today?
- What is one faith step God is prompting you to take? Ask God for vision today. Ask Him to open your eyes to see not just what is happening, but what He is doing.

Make this faith declaration out loud: “I look at my life from God’s point of view, and my destiny becomes clear.”

January 8: Exercise Discipline

Read 1 John 3:1–3. What part of this passage spoke to you the most? What is the link between seeing God’s love and acting in purity? What is the lesson from this passage you must keep working at until Jesus returns?

- Pastor Whitcomb said, “**The right concepts lead to right choices which leads to the right control.**” What does this statement mean to you? How can you get the right concepts into your mind?
- What does “God’s path” mean to you? Where do you need to return

to purity – in thoughts, habits, or relationships?

- What have you normalized that is pulling you off course?
- Right control comes from an everyday exercise of the discipline muscle. Your discipline is tested with every choice you make. Make choices that serve God all the time and you will develop self-control.

Make this faith declaration out loud: “This year, I am growing in self-discipline! I am becoming like Christ everyday with His purity in my mind. I am serving Him faithfully as I await His glorious return.”

January 9: Let God Lead

Read Romans 6:16 and 1 Samuel 17:32-51.

- Pastor Whitcomb said, “**Don’t let yesterday determine your direction. Let GOD determine your direction.**”

What does this statement mean to you?

- Destiny is a journey – built by choices. What you obey shapes what you become. Who or what do you need to stop giving control over your life?
- David did not let his yesterday determine his direction. He had never been to a battle training ground. The only companions he knew were the sheep he tended to. When he heard of the enemy, God in him rose up and directed the battle in favor of the army of Israel. How can you follow David’s example? Don’t let your previous experiences limit you. Let God determine your direction.

Make this faith declaration out loud: “This year, I will see God do Mighty Works! I am walking in Christ and He is enabling me to achieve all that seems impossible to the world.”

Pray this prayer by faith: “Lord Jesus, strengthen my will to obey You. Break every pattern that enslaves me and empower me to choose what leads to life. Amen.”

January 10: Stand with HOPE

Read Psalm 37:34-40.

- Last weekend, Pastor Whitcomb said, **“We don’t achieve our destiny by making promises to God. We achieve our destiny by believing God’s promises to us.”** What does this statement mean to you?

- What are you trying to control that you should commit to God? Where do you need to trust God instead of stressing?
- Point 3 of Pastor Whitcomb's sermon teaches a powerful balance: do what you can, and trust God to do what you cannot. This is destiny faith – commit your ways, trust His help, and refuse the pressure to carry tomorrow alone.
- In a world where there is so much chaos leading to despair, it's easy to get impatient and compromise on your stance in God. But verse 37 tells us that there is “a happy ending” for a godly man who has kept his way right. God's promises are true and sure. Keep your faith in God's promises alive.

Make this faith declaration out loud: “This is my year of DESTINY!

God's plan is being fulfilled in my life as I follow Him in faith.”

January 11: God's Purpose Prevails

Read Proverbs 19:21 and Colossians 1:16.

- Pastor Whitcomb said, “**Don't aim for a good year. Aim for a GOD YEAR.**” What does this statement mean to you?
- What would your destiny look like if you trusted God's purpose fully? What is one plan you should keep – but hold with open hands?
- What is your next obedient step, even if you can't see the full picture?
- You can plan, prepare, and pursue – but the final word belongs to

God's purpose. You must always ask yourself: "What plan do I need to surrender to God's purpose? Where have I been anxious about how it will happen?"

Make this faith declaration out loud: "Many plans may be in my heart, but God's purpose will prevail in my life. I surrender all my plans to the Lord this year."

Pray this prayer by faith: "Lord Jesus, I surrender my plans to Your purpose. Lead me, direct me, and establish what You intend for my life. Let Your will prevail in me. Amen."
