Ezekiel 20:6 “On that day I raised My hand in an oath to them, to bring them out of the land of Egypt into a land that I had searched out for them, ‘flowing with milk and honey,’ the glory of all lands.”

Numbers 13:31-33 “But the men who had gone up with him said, ‘We are not able to go up against the people, for they are stronger than we.’ And they gave the children of Israel a bad report of the land which they had

spied out saying, “The land through which we have gone as spies is a land that devours its inhabitants, and all the people whom we saw in it are men of great stature. There we saw the giants (the descendants of Anak came from the giants); and we were like grasshoppers in our own sight, and so we were in their sight.”

Numbers 14:6-10 “But Joshua the son of Nun and Caleb the son of Jephunneh, who were among those who had spied out the land, tore their clothes; and they spoke to all the congregation of the children of Israel,

saying: ‘The land we passed through to spy out is an exceedingly good land. If the Lord delights in us, then He will bring us into this land and give it to us, ‘a land which flows with milk and honey.’ Only do not rebel against the Lord, nor fear the people of the land, for they are our bread; their protection has departed from them, and the Lord is with us. Do not fear them.’ And all the congregation said to stone them with stones. Now the glory of the Lord appeared in the tabernacle of meeting before all the children of Israel.”

THREE LESSONS ON DESTINY

PERSPECTIVE

1. Destiny Perspective Sees Promise, not Problems.

Numbers 13:32-33 “And they gave the children of Israel a bad report of the land which they had spied out, saying, ‘The land through which we have gone as spies is a land that devours its inhabitants, and all the people whom we saw in it are men of great stature. There we saw the giants (the descendants of Anak came from the giants); and we were like grasshoppers

in our own sight, and so we were in their sight.”

Numbers 14:6-7 “But Joshua the son of Nun and Caleb the son of Jephunneh, who were among those who had spied out the land, tore their clothes; and they spoke to all the congregation of the children of Israel, saying: **‘The land we passed through to spy out is an exceedingly good land.’”**

Proverbs 23:7 “For as he thinks in his heart, so is he...”

Zechariah 4:6 “So he answered and said to me: ‘This is the word of the Lord to Zerubbabel: ‘Not by might nor by power, but by My Spirit,’ says the Lord of hosts.’”

2 Corinthians 5:7 “For we walk by faith, not by sight.”

Jeremiah 1:11-12 “Moreover the word of the Lord came to me, saying, ‘Jeremiah, what do you see? And I said, ‘I see a branch of an almond tree.’ Then the Lord said to me, ‘You have seen well, for I am ready to perform My word.’”

**2. Destiny Perspective Rejects
Fear and Embraces Faith.**

Numbers 14:8-9 “If the Lord delights in us, then He will bring us into this land and give it to us, ‘a land which flows with milk and honey.’ Only do not rebel against the Lord, nor fear the people of the land, for they are our bread; their protection has departed

from them, and the Lord is with us. Do not fear them.”

2 Timothy 1:7 “For God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind.”

Number 13:30 “Then Caleb quieted the people before Moses, and said, ‘Let us go up at once and take possession, for we are well able to overcome it.’”

Destiny favors conviction over consensus.

3. Destiny Perspective Trusts God's Presence Over Human Power.

Numbers 14:9b “...for they are our bread; their protection has departed from them, and the Lord is with us. Do not fear them.”

Giants look different when God is standing with you.

Psalm 16:8 “I have set the Lord always before me; because He is at my right hand I shall not be moved.”

When God is present, risk becomes obedience.

Numbers 14: 24 “But My servant Caleb, because he has a different spirit in him and has followed Me fully, I will bring him into the land where he went, and his descendants shall inherit it.”

Memory Verse: Jeremiah 1:12 “Then the Lord said to me, ‘You have seen well, for I am ready to perform My word.’”
