

- If every Christian practiced Matthew 7:5, how might that change the spiritual climate of Ghana?

Prayer: Ask the Lord to bring revival to Ghana and ask Him to begin in YOU. Pray that God will search your heart and purify your life.

March 14: AMBASSADORS FOR CHRIST

Read 2 Corinthians 5:11-21.

- What are some things you appreciate about Ghana and its people?
- Scripture calls believers ambassadors for Christ. What does it mean to represent Christ in your nation?
- In what parts of your life do you most feel like an ambassador for Christ? In what ways do you feel qualified to represent God? What would make you feel more equipped?
- How well do you feel Christians in Ghana are doing at representing Christ? How are you contributing to this – both good and bad?

Pray this prayer from a sincere heart of faith: “Heavenly Father, help me to be an ambassador for You in Ghana. Father, teach me to pray. Holy Spirit, empower me to act. Jesus, show me what it means to represent You in my nation. Thank You, Lord! Amen.”

March 15: UNITY IN THE CHURCH

Read John 17.

- Jesus prayed that His followers would live in unity. Why is unity among believers so important for the witness of the Church?
- What do you think are some of the greatest causes of disunity among Christians?
- Reflect on any personal experiences of disunity in the Church. What lessons did you learn from those moments?
- How has division in the Church harmed the spread of the Gospel in Ghana?
- How can you personally promote unity among believers in your church and community?

Pray this prayer: “Lord Jesus, You prayed that Your followers would be united. Forgive me for any ways I have contributed to division. Help me to live in humility, love, and unity with other believers so that the world may see Your love through us. Amen.”

Daily Devotional

March 9: PRAY FOR THE NATION

Read 1 Timothy 2:1-8.

- What truth from this past weekend’s sermon challenged or encouraged you the most? How will you apply it this week?
- If you were explaining the message to someone who does not follow Jesus, how would you summarize it in a few sentences?
- Today’s Bible reading urges us to pray for those in authority so that we may live peaceful and godly lives. How intentional are you about praying for Ghana and its leaders? Regardless of your political views, we all need to pray more for Ghana and our leaders. Commit to praying for Ghana.

- Reflect on how prayer can influence the spiritual direction of a nation. What specific needs in Ghana should believers consistently pray about?

Pray this prayer in faith: “Dear Father in Heaven, I pray for Ghana. Guide our leaders so that peace will prevail in our land. Please heal our land and grant us leaders who have the best interest of our nation at heart. In Jesus’ Name I pray. Amen.”

March 10: HONOR AUTHORITY

Read Romans 13:1-7 carefully.

- On a scale of 1–10, how would you honestly rate your attitude toward authority (1 = very submissive, 10 = very resistant)? What does that reveal about your heart?
- For many of us, this passage in Romans 13 is very challenging. We don’t often link our spiritual maturity to paying taxes and submitting to government. But when we believe that no one can come to power except the Lord places him or her there, it helps us to accept God’s commands regarding taxes and submission to earthly authority.
- Why do you think Scripture connects spiritual maturity with obedience to authority, including paying taxes and respecting laws?
- Reflect on the truth that all authority ultimately comes from God. How does this understanding shape the way you respond to leaders and institutions?
- Are there areas where you have been negligent in obeying the laws of the land? Repent of it.

Prayer: Ask the Lord to convict you of any area where you have been negligent in obeying the law of the land. Pray for His Spirit to give you the grace to be submissive to the government and to obey the laws.

March 11: GOD ABOVE ALL

Read Daniel 3.

- This passage reminds us that there are limits to obedience toward human authority. When leaders demand something that contradicts God’s commands, believers must remain faithful to God.

- Have you ever been pressured by someone in authority – a supervisor, teacher, or religious leader – to do something that conflicted with your faith? How did you respond?
- Reflect on the courage of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego. What helped them remain faithful despite the consequences?
- What spiritual disciplines can help strengthen your courage to stand for God’s truth?

Make this faith declaration out loud: “God searches my heart and leads me in truth. I surrender my heart completely to Him and will remain faithful to His Word.”

March 12: A NATION IN PRAYER

Read 2 Chronicles 6:12-40.

- Prayer for our nation is not high on most prayer lists, but it should be. When King Solomon dedicated the temple, he offered one of the loftiest prayers in Scripture. Solomon assembled the people and stood in front of them and lifted his arms toward heaven. Then he knelt. List a few things we can learn about prayer for our nation from Solomon.
- Do you regularly pray for our nation? If so, what do you pray? What do you think we should pray for our nation?
- Examine verses 22–39. What specific concerns did Solomon bring before God on behalf of the people?
- How could you adapt Solomon’s prayer and apply those same requests to Ghana today?

Pray this prayer in faith: “Father, we lift Ghana before You. Forgive our sins, heal our land, and lead our nation in righteousness. Turn the hearts of our people back to You so that justice, peace, and godliness will flourish. In Jesus’ Name I pray. Amen.”

March 13: REVIVAL BEGINS WITH YOU

Read Matthew 7:1-12.

- It is easy to criticize leaders and institutions, but Jesus instructs us to examine our own lives first. How does personal repentance contribute to national revival?
- Reflect honestly: Are there attitudes or behaviors in your life that need correction before you expect change in others?
- Why do you think God often begins revival by transforming individual hearts rather than institutions?
