DAILY DEVOTIONAL: GOD'S UNSTOPPABLE GRACE

Here is a Daily Devotional to enable you to make the most out of this sermon. You may use it for your personal growth or discuss it together in your Life Group.

March 23: New Life by Grace

Read Ephesians 2:1-10.

- What spoke to you the most in the sermon “**God’s Unstoppable Grace**”? Did any truth Pastor Whitcomb shared surprise you?
- What is one truth you especially needed to hear?
- When you hear the word *grace*, what comes to mind? How did the sermon deepen your understanding of grace?
- Of the three truths about grace – you’re never too lost, you’re never too low, or you’re never too late – which

do you need most right now? Why?

Prayer: Pray every day this week for God's Grace to be poured out upon you. Take a few minutes today and thank the Lord for His Unstoppable Grace!

March 24: Grace Through Repentance

Read Psalm 51.

- Pastor Whitcomb said, “**Guilt is the starting point for grace.**” What does this statement mean to you? How does this truth apply to your life?
- If you were explaining the message from this sermon to someone who does not follow Jesus, or who does not attend church, what would you tell that person? How would you describe grace to this person?
- No one wants to hear bad news. Yet the good news of the Gospel isn't good news unless you understand the bad

news - we are all sinners and we are all lost. The more you see your guilt, the more you receive God's Unstoppable Grace.

- Why is it important to understand sin before fully appreciating grace?

Prayer: Ask God to convict you of the sin in your life! Read Psalm 51 out loud as a personal prayer to God. Confess your sins and ask God to forgive you.

March 25: Restored by the Cross
Read Psalm 28.

- Pastor Whitcomb taught us, “**The purpose of the cross is to repair the irreparable.**” What does this mean to you?
- Is there any area of your life today that you feel is irreparable? Bring that area to Jesus in prayer and ask Him to do the impossible by the power of His grace.

- What was your favorite story from the sermon this weekend?
- What spoke to you the most about that story? How did hearing that story minister to you?

Prayer: “Lord, repair every damaged area in my life. Heal every hurt and grant me grace today. Thank you for coming to die on the Cross for me. Thank you for your love and grace. In Jesus’ name I pray. Amen!”

March 26: Strength in Weakness

Read 2 Corinthians 12:1-10.

- Pastor Whitcomb said, “**If you are weak today, then you are just the person God is looking for. If you are in a pit, you’re the person God is seeking. You are a candidate for His grace.**” What does this statement mean to you? How does this truth apply to your life?

- In what areas of your life do you feel weak right now? Paul was beset by a ‘thorn in the flesh’ so that in his weakness he could learn to lean on God’s grace. Sometimes God allows trials and difficulties into our lives so that we will learn to trust in Him. He doesn’t want us to depend on our own strength. Rather, He wants us to receive strength from His grace. How can your weakness become an opportunity to experience God’s grace?
- Do not be discouraged by any trial or trouble you are facing today. Instead, pray and ask God for His grace to overwhelm you so that you can rejoice and be strong even in the storm. Take a moment to also encourage someone else today who you know needs a word of hope.

Make this faith declaration out loud:

“I will not be discouraged by any trial or trouble I face in my life today. I am confident that the Lord is on my side and I will come out victorious.”

March 27: Transformed by Grace

Read Romans 5:1-11.

- Pastor Whitcomb said, “Because of God’s Unstoppable Grace, we’re going to be seated with Him and united with Him in heaven. No matter how late it is in life, you still have eternity ahead with Jesus.” What does this statement mean to you?
- How can knowing that God has an eternal plan for you help you to harness the power of His grace to overcome sin and temptation today? How does God’s grace transform us?
- Which part of your life do you need to allow God’s grace to come in and transform?
- How can you actively respond to God’s grace this week?

Pray this prayer from a sincere heart: “Father God, thank You. Thank You for Jesus. Thank You for sending Him

to give me Your love. I was wretched, but You saved me by Your amazing grace. Give me the passion and strength to now live for You fully. I ask this in the all-powerful name of Jesus. Amen.”

March 28: Made New in Christ

Read 2 Peter 1:1-11.

- Pastor Whitcomb said, “**Grace doesn’t make you a better version of your old self. Grace makes you brand new in Christ!**” What does this statement mean to you?
- Reflect: Grace not only grants us salvation; it also gives us the power to live fruitful lives for Christ here on earth. We are changed by grace. It causes us to love our Lord and seek to please Him. Grace begins our initial transformation, and also maintains it. Grace is the original spark that starts the fire of love for God in our hearts, and it is also the fuel that keeps the fire going.

- From what you have learned from Pastor Whitcomb’s message on **“God’s Unstoppable Grace”** and from your own experience, how would you describe “the incomparable riches” of God’s grace? In other words, what is so amazing about grace?

Make this faith declaration out loud:

“I am a candidate of God’s grace and His grace is sufficient for me. I reject every lie of the enemy about the work of God’s grace in my life.”

March 29: Living for Eternity
Read Ephesians 1:1-11.

- Pastor Whitcomb said, “**No matter how many opportunities you’ve missed in this life, you still have unlimited opportunities in eternity.**” What does this statement mean to you? How does this truth give you hope?
- List three things from today’s Bible reading that show us the amazing benefits of God’s grace.
- How can you live differently today in light of these blessings?
- What is one commitment you want to make as you finish this devotional?

Pray this prayer today: “Lord, I humble myself before You today so that You will grant me more grace. Fill my life with grace so that I may run my race faithfully to the end of this life. I receive Your grace by faith today and I worship You in Jesus’ name. Amen!”
