



UNSTOPPABLE

DAILY DEVOTIONAL: GOD'S UNSTOPPABLE PEOPLE

Here is a Daily Devotional to enable you to make the most out of this sermon. You may use it for your personal growth or discuss it together in your Life Group.

March 16: YOU ARE THE CHURCH. *Read Matthew 16:13-19.*

- What spoke to you the most in the sermon “**God’s Unstoppable People**”? Did any truth Pastor Whitcomb shared surprise you? What was one truth that you really needed to hear? Why do you think God wanted you to hear that truth now?
- Jesus declared that He would build His Church and that the gates of hell would not prevail against it. What does this promise reveal about the power and future of the Church?
- Pastor Whitcomb said, “**You can’t**

attend church – You ARE the church!” What does this statement mean to you? How does this change the way you think about your identity and responsibility as a believer?

Pray this prayer from a sincere heart: “Dear Father God, thank You for showing us what the church should be like. Help us to become like the first church. Revive us with Your Holy Spirit so that our church can become all You want us to be. I thank You in the name of Jesus for Your mercy and Your grace. Amen.”

March 17: GOD’S ETERNAL PLAN
Read Ephesians 3:1-11.

- When you hear the word “church”, what image or idea comes to mind? Do you see it as an institution, an organization, or a movement of God? How do your view of the church influence the way you think about and relate to God?

- Ephesians 3:10 teaches that God uses the Church to display His wisdom to the world. What does this reveal about how important the Church is in God's plan?
- Do your beliefs ever get in the way of your love? Do your views hinder you from loving someone? Most of us wrestle with that tension because we haven't embraced the truth of the Gospel: if Jesus died for us then He is for us. God's unmerited love for us and for those around us must shape our behavior.
- Are there believers you struggle to love or accept? How does remembering Christ's love for you challenge your attitude toward them?

Prayer: God has called you to love them whether you like them or not. Your worship to Jesus is a lie if you don't love the people around you. Today, take time to forgive anyone who has offended you. Ask the Lord to show you if you need to ask forgiveness from anyone. Pray for His love to fill your heart.

March 18: FREEDOM THROUGH LOVE

Read Galatians 5:1-15.

- Has your experience with church emphasized rules and performance, or grace and freedom? How has that shaped your understanding of God?
- In what ways do you find yourself trying to be justified to God through rules (the law) instead of through Jesus? Why is it so tempting to try to earn God's favor by following rules?
- Reflect on your relationship with God. Are you serving Him from gratitude and love, or from pressure and obligation?
- Who is one person you need to do a better job of loving? What is one thing you can do this week to love that person?

- Who is one person you can invite to Friend Day this coming weekend? Act now and help your friend join the Agape Family.

Prayer: Say a prayer toward Friend Day and especially all the people you are inviting.

March 19: POWER IN UNITY

Read Matthew 18:15-20.

- There is great power when the church lives in unity. However, unity in the church isn't automatic. What pattern does Jesus give us to follow in these verses that will bring true unity?
- Pastor Whitcomb said, **“You’ll never accomplish God’s destiny for your life until you have the right connection with the right people.”** What does this statement mean to you? Are you presently experiencing the right connection with the right people?

- On a scale of one to ten, with one being none and ten being perfect, how would you score the unity you experience with other Christians?

Prayer: When believers unite in Christ, there is great spiritual power. God promises His presence among us, and our prayers become effective as we stand together in faith. Ask God to strengthen your commitment to love, serve, and walk in unity with others in the church.

March 20: DISCOVER YOUR ROLE
Read 1 Corinthians 12:4-27.

- Scripture teaches that every believer has been given spiritual gifts. Why do you think God distributes different gifts among His people?
- Have you discovered your spiritual gift? Are you using it today for the benefit of others? Ask God to reveal to you the gift He has given you.

- Every disciple of Jesus has a part to play in making sure the church functions well. Are you playing your part? Are you doing your job for Christ and His Church? Determine today to begin serving with your gift so that others can be helped.

Declare in faith: “God has given me gifts to strengthen His Church. I will use them faithfully so that others may grow and God may be glorified.”

March 21: COMMITTED TO THE FAMILY

Read Ephesians 4:1-16.

- Pastor Whitcomb said, “**We grow by being committed to a spiritual family at a local church.**” What does this statement mean to you?
- In what ways do you need other people? Reflect on the people who have helped shape your faith. How have they influenced your spiritual journey? How could you be a blessing

to other people at church? In what ways do you think people need you? What special role can you play at church?

- One powerful way we can support one another is through prayer. Instead of focusing only on your own needs, choose today to pray intentionally for others – your pastors, church members, family, and friends. Ask God to meet their needs and fill their lives with His presence and peace.

March 22: DEVOTED COMMUNITY
Read Acts 2:42-47.

- Acts 2:42 tells us that the first believers devoted themselves to teaching, fellowship, prayer, and community. Which of these areas is strongest in your life? Which needs growth?
- In John 17:20-21, Jesus prayed, “I pray also for those who will believe in Me through their message, that all of them may be one, Father, just as You are in Me and I am in You.” Do you think Jesus’ prayer was answered in the first church? Why or why not? Do you think Jesus’ prayer is being answered in the church today? Why or why not?
- Write out three ways you will become more committed to the community of Agape House.
