



# UNSTOPPABLE

## DAILY DEVOTIONAL: GOD'S UNSTOPPABLE PRAISE

Here is a Daily Devotional to enable you to make the most out of this sermon. You may use it for your personal growth or discuss it together in your Life Group.

### **March 30: Gratitude.**

Read Psalm 103.

- What stands out to you the most in this Psalm?
- What spoke to you the most in the sermon “**God’s Unstoppable Praise**”? Did any truth Pastor Whitcomb shared surprise you? What was one truth that you really needed to hear?
- On a scale of 1 to 10 (when 1 = ungrateful and 10 = extremely grateful) how would you rate yourself in the area of gratitude? How can you

grow in this area of your life?

- What are some of the reasons you aren't as grateful as you should be?

**Pray this prayer by faith:** “Dear Father God, thank You for the many blessings and benefits You have given to me. Develop an attitude of gratitude in my life. Help me to never forget the good things You have done for me. In Jesus' Name I pray. Amen.”

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## **March 31: I am blessed!**

Read Ecclesiastes 6:9.

- In Ecclesiastes 6:9 God tells us, “Enjoy what you have rather than desiring what you don't have. Just dreaming about nice things is meaningless - like chasing the wind.”
- Pastor Whitcomb said, “**I will not allow what I don't have to keep me from enjoying what I do have.**” What does this statement

mean to you? How can you apply it to your life this week?

- Advertising surrounds us and is constantly tempting us to desire and get more things. How can you overcome the lure of marketing so that you will be content with what you have?
- In which ways are you more blessed than the richest man in the world? List some ways that God has blessed you other than material goods. Take time today to thank God for the blessings you have that cannot be seen.

**Pray this prayer by faith:** “Lord Jesus, I can never repay You for all that You have done for me. Open my eyes to see the wonderful blessings You have given to me, both seen and unseen. Let my life be an offering of praise to You. Amen!”

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## **April 1: Contentment.**

Read Luke 15:11-32.

- In this passage, Jesus shares the Parable of the Lost Son. In the story, the youngest son “wanted it now” while the oldest son thought he “deserved more.” In what areas of your life are you experiencing the most discontentment? How can you become more content?
- Pastor Whitcomb taught us, “**Until Christ is all you have, you won’t realize Christ is all you need.**” What does this statement mean to you?

**Make this faith declaration out loud:**

“I have all that I need because I have Jesus Christ! He is the source of my life. He is my all-sufficient One.”

**Pray this prayer by faith:** “Dear Lord Jesus, I draw near to You today. Please draw near to me and fill me with Your presence. Help me to focus my eyes on You. Magnify Your power, greatness, and

love in my sight. Teach me to trust You.  
Amen.”

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## **April 2: Overflow with praise.**

Read Colossians 3:12-17.

- According to these verses, what role does the Word of God play in developing gratitude in your heart?
- Pastor Whitcomb said, “**When your mouth overflows with praise, your life will overflow with happiness.**” What does this statement mean to you? How does this truth apply to your life?
- One of the biggest problems in the world today is the sense of entitlement most people have. Entitlement says, “I deserve more. I deserve better.” How does the act of praising God prevent entitlement from entering our hearts?

**Make this faith declaration out loud:**

“I am a product of God’s grace! I am saved and called because God chose me. God loves me!”

**Pray this prayer by faith:** “Lord, I humble myself before You today. I acknowledge that I deserved punishment, but You saved me by Your grace. Forgive me for all ingratitude in my life. Cleanse me from the attitude of entitlement. Let my life overflow with praise, in Jesus’ name. Amen!”

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**April 3: God is working for my good.**

Read Philippians 4:11-13.

What did Paul mean when he says he “learned to be content”? How may God be teaching you contentment right now? What are some ways to cultivate gratitude in your daily life?

- Pastor Whitcomb said, “**Don’t magnify your problem! Magnify your God! When you magnify**

**God and return praise to Him then you acknowledge that He is Lord. Leave the results in God's hands and He will always give you His best.**" What does this statement mean to you?

- The Cross looked like a defeat. The disciples ran away in fear. But in fact, the Cross was God's great means of salvation for mankind. What can you learn today from the Cross about trusting God to work things out for good in your life?

**Make this faith declaration out loud:**  
"I delight in the Lord! Jesus means more to me than all the riches of this world. He is working all things for my good. I do not fear or worry, for Christ has won the victory for me."

**Pray this prayer by faith:** "Father, work all things for my good. Just as you used the Cross to bring my salvation, use every circumstance I face to bring me to perfection. Keep my heart centered on You. In Jesus' name I pray. Amen."

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## **April 4: Praise = Power.**

Read Psalm 30:1-12.

- What does it mean that, “joy comes with the morning”? Think of a time when you experienced weeping for a night but found joy in the morning. What did you learn from that experience?
- Pastor Whitcomb said, “**When GRATITUDE dominates your attitude then POWER will dominate your life.**” What does this statement mean to you?
- Read Psalm 30:1-12. What does it mean that, “joy comes with the morning”? Think of a time when you experienced weeping for a night but found joy in the morning. What did you learn from that experience?

- What can you learn about God in these verses from Psalm 30? How does this truth help build your faith?

**Make this faith declaration out loud:**

“Miracles are taking place in my life today as I praise God. Power is released into my life today as I praise God. New doors are opening for me today as I praise God!”

**Pray this prayer by faith:** “Lord Jesus, I thank You in every circumstance right now. I trust in You to work all things for good in my life. Please make me whole in every area as I continually praise You. Amen!”

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**April 5: He is RISEN!**

**Read this Scripture out loud:** Psalm 34:3-4 “Oh, magnify the Lord with me, and let us exalt His name together. I sought the Lord, and He heard me, and delivered me from all my fears.”

- Pastor Whitcomb said, “**When God becomes big in your eyes then your praise will become big,**

**too.”** What does this statement mean to you?

- Christ triumphed over everything. And because He is victorious, we too will be victorious in all things as we trust in Him. Praise is the language of faith, so give God great praise on this great day! Celebrate the Great God because He is undefeated!

**Make this faith declaration out loud:**

“My God is undefeated! Jesus is Lord over everything. He has conquered death. He has conquered sin, and satan, and sickness. His power is my power. Because Jesus lives, I live also!”

**Pray this prayer by faith:** “Father God, thank You for raising Jesus from the dead! Thank You for Your power. Let Your power flow into me and through me to the world. In Jesus’ name. Amen!”
