DAILY DEVOTIONAL: GOD'S UNSTOPPABLE LIFE

Here is a Daily Devotional to enable you to make the most out of this sermon. You may use it for your personal growth or discuss it together in your Life Group.

April 13: GOD'S UNSTOPPABLE LIFE!

Read Romans 8:31-39 and meditate on the truth in these verses.

- What spoke to you the most in the sermon “**God’s Unstoppable Life**”? Were there any truths shared that surprised you? What was one truth that you really needed to hear?
- Pastor Whitcomb gave us three reasons we possess God’s Unstoppable Life through Jesus’ resurrection: **His resurrection gives us Access to God, Authority in God, and God’s**

Agape Love. Which of these three do you need to focus on most right now? How can today's message help you build these three things in your life?

- Are you living as someone who carries resurrection life or someone still limited by fear and doubt? Where are you still living beneath what Christ has already made available to you?

Pray this prayer: “Dear Jesus, I praise You for Your mighty power! May everything that You have destined for me to receive be manifest in my life. Increase my faith so that I can live in the overflow of access, authority, and Agape love. I thank You by faith. Amen!”

April 14: ACCESS.

Read Romans 5:1-11.

- Forgiveness of your sins is the first step in restoring your relationship with God – but it's not the only step. Once your sins are forgiven, God

wants you to interact with Him in a loving relationship every day. Have your sins been forgiven? Have you gone on to build a relationship with God where you interact with Him daily? Why or why not?

- How would you currently rate your access to God? What steps can you take this week to increase your interaction with God and grow in your relationship with Him?
- Access to God = access to grace, power, favor, anointing, love, peace, and joy. The closer you are to the Father in heaven, the more you receive of His gifts. Take time today to rejoice that you are a friend of God, and that His door is always open to you.

Make this declaration in faith: “I am forgiven by the Grace of God. I have access to God. I draw near daily and live in His presence. Because of Jesus’ resurrection, I have access to grace, power, favor, anointing, love, peace, and joy. The gifts of God are evident in my life.”

April 15: TRANSFORMED INTO HIS IMAGE.

Read 2 Corinthians 3:7-18.

- This past weekend, Pastor Whitcomb said, **“When your Maker becomes your mirror, you see yourself as you ought to see yourself.”** What does this statement mean to you? Are you experiencing this truth in your life? Why or why not?
- Are you intentionally positioning yourself in God’s presence to be transformed? What habits are shaping your identity more than God’s Word?
- Access to God is essential for spiritual growth and development. We can only become like Christ when we spend time in His presence. If transformation requires time in His presence, how consistent are you?

Pray this prayer from a sincere heart of faith: “Dear Father in heaven, please remove every barrier that is separating me from Your presence. Remove every veil from my face and let me see You. Let me reflect Your glory, in Jesus’ Name. Amen.”

April 16: AUTHORITY.

Read Ephesians 1:15-23.

- What speaks to you most in this passage? List three prayers that the Apostle Paul prays in these verses and begin to pray these prayers for yourself.
- There is no doubt that the authority of Jesus Christ is supreme. Through His resurrection, Jesus conquered the final enemy and destroyed it. Now, all things are under Christ’s authority. As members of His body, His authority dwells in us. The closer you are connected to Jesus, the more authority you will exercise in life.

- Do you truly believe you carry Christ's authority or do you live as if you are powerless? In what areas of your life have you allowed the enemy to operate unchecked?
- What fear or mindset is limiting your boldness?

Declare by faith out loud: "I am a child of God. I am joined to Christ Jesus. His resurrection power dwells in me. I walk in the authority of Jesus, the name above every name. All glory and praise to God!"

April 17: UNITED WITH CHRIST.

Read Colossians 2:6-23. Verse 10 says, "You are complete through your union with Christ."

- You may feel that you lack certain things, but when you unite with Christ you have all you need for life and godliness. You may feel inferior in your faith, but your union with Jesus provides everything you need.

Do you truly believe you are complete in Christ or do you still feel lacking?

- Pastor Whitcomb taught us, **“Boldness is a behavior born out of belief.”** What beliefs about yourself or about God are keeping you from living boldly for Christ? In what areas of your life do you most need to develop boldness?
- In what area of your life are you living as if you are separated from Him? What would change if you fully embraced your union with Christ? Are your actions reflecting your identity in Christ or contradicting it?

Make your faith declaration today: “I take authority in Jesus Christ over every power of the enemy. I command every spiritual force of darkness to be bound and cast aside today, in Jesus’ Name. I lift up the Name that is above every other name and exalt the name of Jesus!”

April 18: BELOVED CHILD OF GOD.

Read 1 John 3:1-3.

- What speaks to you most from this passage of Scripture? Of all the truths listed here, which one blesses you the most?
- Although we are His children and deeply loved, God is forming us into something better than what we are now. What aspect of becoming like Christ appeals to you most? If God loves us, why does He want to change us to be like Jesus? How will being like Jesus be better for us?
- Take time each day to remind yourself of your true identity: you are a beloved child of God because He has chosen to love you. You may want to write it in your journal or put it on a note card where you can see it daily.
- **Pray this prayer from a sincere heart of faith:** “Heavenly Father, help me fully embrace my identity as

Your child. Let Your love shape how I live and how I see myself. Thank You for making me part of Your beloved family through Jesus Christ Your Son. In Jesus' name I pray. Amen.”

April 19: GOD'S AGAPE LOVE.

Read Ephesians 1:3-14.

- This past weekend, Pastor Whitcomb said, **“Grace is not based on what you’ve done. It’s based on what Jesus has done. Grace is not merited by your condition. Grace is made possible by His crucifixion in your place.”** What does this statement mean to you?
- God chose you and loved you before you were born. This means that there is absolutely nothing you did to deserve or earn His favor. If you can’t earn His favor, then what should motivate you to obey God?
- Do you find it difficult to accept God’s

love? Ask the Lord to deliver you from trying to earn His love. Pray for deliverance from a religion based on good works, and begin to develop a relationship with the Lord who loves you with unconditional love.

Pray this prayer from a sincere heart of faith: “Father, help me receive Your love fully. Deliver me from striving and teach me to live in the freedom of Your grace, in Jesus’ name. Amen.”
