



# UNSTOPPABLE

## DAILY DEVOTIONAL: GOD'S UNSTOPPABLE POWER

Here is a Daily Devotional to enable you to make the most out of this sermon. You may use it for your personal growth or discuss it together in your Life Group.

### **April 6: Unlimited POWER!**

*Read Psalm 33 and focus on verses 6-9.*

- Meditate on the truth in these verses: God created the world with just His word! He didn't need raw materials or a factory. He can create something out of nothing! What are the implications of this truth for your life today?
- What spoke to you the most in the sermon "**God's Unstoppable Power**"? Did any truth Pastor Whitcomb shared surprise you? What was one truth that you really needed to hear?

- Pastor Whitcomb said, “Jesus’ mighty acts are proof that His power is greater than the power of the enemy. By dispossessing the devil and by destroying his works, Jesus made it clear that His Kingdom was greater than the kingdom of satan.” What does this statement mean to you?

**Pray this prayer by faith:** “Almighty Father, enlighten my spirit to grasp the revelation of Your power. Embolden me to walk in the fullness of Your power by Your Spirit at work in me. In Jesus’ name I pray. Amen!”

## **April 7: UNDEFEATED!**

*Read Acts 2:22-41.*

- The most immediate response to the resurrection by Christ’s disciples was to go out and win souls to the Kingdom of God. Who can you witness to about Jesus this week? The Resurrection of Jesus is GOOD NEWS

– so make a decision to start telling others about the great things Jesus has done. Go and TELL the world that Jesus is risen from the dead!

- In his sermon, Pastor Whitcomb taught us, “**When God raised Jesus from the dead, He won the final victory over the final enemy.**” What does this statement mean to you? Why is death the final enemy?
- Anything dead does not yield positive results. Are there any areas of your life that you need God to revive? Pray that the anointing of God’s Spirit will brood over the dead areas of your life and breathe life into them.
- Now, pray for others in your Life Group or among your family and friends. Ask God to release resurrection power into those you know who need to be revived.

**Make this faith declaration out loud:**  
“JESUS is UNDEFEATED! He has conquered every foe, and His power has no

end. And because Jesus has won the victory, I can live in victory, too!”

## **April 8: The ETERNAL ONE**

*Read Hebrews 13:8-21 and focus on verses 8 and 20-21.*

- What speaks to you most in this passage? Use the words in verses 20-21 as a prayer for yourself today.
- In his sermon, Pastor Whitcomb said, “**God is not the great I WAS – He is the great I AM.**” What does this statement mean to you?
- Think about the three biggest challenges you face in life right now. Are these challenges temporary or eternal? Put your current problems in the hands of the Eternal God and trust Him to handle them today.

**Make this faith declaration out loud:**  
“Every problem I face is temporary. Every promise I have in Christ is eternal!”

## **April 9: “Your Kingdom Come”**

*Isaiah 9:7* says, “Power and peace will be in His Kingdom and will continue to grow forever.”

- The power and peace of God’s Kingdom will continue to grow forever as we continue to grow in our knowledge of Christ and our service to Him.
- Pastor Whitcomb said, “**Jesus didn’t save you just so you could go to heaven. He saved you so that His Kingdom would come to earth through you!**” What does this statement mean to you?
- If you were explaining the message of the Kingdom of God to someone who does not follow Jesus, what would you

say? How would you describe the Kingdom of God in your own words?

**Pray this prayer by faith:** “I love You, Lord! Use me to expand Your Kingdom. Fill me with Your power today. Use me to spread Your peace today. I offer myself to You for Your service. Amen!”

## **April 10: Victory in Jesus!**

*Read Luke 17:20-37 and focus on verse 21.*

- How do you understand this passage? Share your thoughts with your Life Group.
- In his sermon Pastor Whitcomb declared, “**JESUS is UNDEFEATED! He has conquered every foe and His power has no end. And because Jesus has won the victory, you can live in victory, too!**” Do you believe it’s possible for you to live in victory? Why or why not?

- On a scale of 1 to 10 (when 1 = defeated and 10 = totally victorious) how would you rate your level of victory in your Christian faith? How can you achieve greater victory in your life?
- Please take turns to pray with your group members for the Kingdom of God to come into your hearts.
- Stand in the authority of Jesus and command the enemy to flee from your life, your family, and your community. Begin to arise in faith and pull down strongholds in your world.

**Declare out loud:** “Satan and demon powers, I bind your evil works in Jesus’ name. I command you to flee from me and all that pertains to me right now. You cannot harm me, for Jesus has given me authority over you.” Now take some time to praise the Lord!

## April 11: The New Kingdom

*Read Colossians 1:11-20.*

- What can you personally learn about God in these verses? Using truths in this text, write a prayer of praise to the Lord.
- Pastor Whitcomb said, “**God WANTS to SHARE His Kingdom with US!**” What does this statement mean to you?
- Do you believe God can turn the seemingly unsurmountable situations in your life around for your good? List any challenge or situation you are facing today. Look at all the Bible verses Pastor Whitcomb used in his sermon and pick the three verses that encourage you the most. Declare these words from God over your problems today and see God’s power move in your life.

**Make this faith declaration out loud:**  
“God has rescued me from the kingdom of darkness through His Son Jesus. I am now

a citizen of His Eternal Kingdom.  
Hallelujah!”

## **April 12: The Worthy Call**

*Read Romans 8:31-39.*

- What speaks to you most in this passage? Which promise in these verses do you need to rely upon most right now?
- Pastor Whitcomb said, **“God’s eternal, triumphant, and unstoppable Kingdom in me means that I am eternal, triumphant, and unstoppable!”** What does this statement mean to you?
- Are you living in a manner that is worthy of the call of God on your life? Make a commitment today to let God’s power transform you so that

you will live a life that reflects the triumphant power of God's Kingdom.

- The devil often reminds us of our sins so that we will feel separated from God. But if God does not condemn us then we should not listen to any other voice that condemns us.

**Pray this prayer:** “Lord Jesus, I submit my life to You. I plead Your blood over my entire life. Satan, I bind your voice of condemnation. I command you to flee from me now, in Jesus’ name. Amen.”

**Rejoice in the fact that Jesus is interceding for you today!**
