

- Rev. Prince Mensah challenged us, "***The happiest believers are usually the busiest servants. Serving expands your capacity for God's blessing.***" Have you experienced this in your life? Have you seen this truth displayed in someone else's life?
- God never intended His blessings to stop with us. Every blessing He gives is an invitation to become a blessing to someone else. How has God blessed you so that you can bless others?
- In what ways can you become a greater channel of God's love? Are you holding onto God's blessings tightly or freely sharing them?
- How does generosity reveal God's character? Who can you intentionally bless this week?

Prayer: *Thank God for every blessing He has entrusted to you. Ask Him to help you use your gifts, resources, and opportunities to bless others generously.*

August 9: Shine for His Glory

Read Matthew 5:16.

- Rev. Prince asked, "***Will your life be consumed by yourself, or will it become a blessing to generations?***" How did you answer this question? How do you want to be remembered in God's Kingdom?
- The greatest legacy is not measured by what you accumulate but by the lives you influence for Christ. A life lived for God's glory leaves a lasting impact that reaches beyond one generation. Every act of obedience, kindness, service, and generosity points people toward the Father.
- What kind of legacy are you building today? How are your actions pointing others toward Christ?
- Who has been influenced by your walk with God? What changes would help your life reflect God's glory more clearly?

Prayer: *Pray that your life will consistently reflect Christ, inspire others to glorify God, and leave an eternal legacy through faithful service and obedience.*

Daily Devotional for MADE FOR MORE THAN YOURSELF

Here is a Daily Devotional to enable you to make the most out of this sermon. You may use it for your personal growth or discuss it together in your Life Group.

August 3: Designed for Purpose

Read Ephesians 2:10.

- What truth from last weekend's message, "***MADE FOR MORE THAN YOURSELF***" impacted you the most? Why do you think God highlighted that truth to you? How will what you heard affect your life?
- What gives your life the greatest sense of purpose? Are your daily decisions shaped more by personal ambition or by God's calling?
- Which gifts has God entrusted to you for His Kingdom? What good work may God be inviting you to embrace in this season?
- How can you intentionally align your life with God's purpose this week?

Prayer: *Pray that God will reveal His purpose for your life more clearly. Ask Him to align your heart with His will, and help you faithfully walk in every good work He has prepared for you.*

August 4: Known Before Birth

Read Jeremiah 1:5.

- Rev. Prince stated last weekend, "***Our lives become meaningful only when they are surrendered to God's assignment.***" What does this statement mean to you?

- How does knowing that God knew you before you were born change your perspective?
- Which fear has kept you from embracing God's assignment? Have you allowed comparison to distract you from God's unique calling?
- What gifts or passions has God given you that point toward His purpose?
- Many people spend years trying to discover who they are because they first seek identity in success, relationships, or possessions. Yet our identity is found in the One who created us. How can you intentionally pursue God's calling this week?

Make this declaration in faith: *“God knew me before I was born and created me with purpose. I will confidently walk in the calling He has prepared for my life.”*

August 5: A Life on the Altar

Read Romans 12:1.

- Rev. Prince said, **“Maturity is measured by how much we think about others rather than ourselves.”** Rewrite this sentence in your own words.
- A self-centered life is ultimately an empty life. God calls us to something far greater than simply pursuing our own comfort and ambitions. What areas of your life are still difficult to surrender to God?
- Does your lifestyle reflect someone living for God's purpose or personal comfort? How can your life become a greater blessing to others?
- What sacrifice might God be asking you to make for His Kingdom? How does surrender lead to greater purpose?

Prayer: *Pray for a surrendered heart that delights in God's will, seeks His Kingdom above personal ambition, and lives each day for His glory.*

August 6: The Path to Greatness

Read Mark 10:42–45.

- How have Jesus' words in today's reading changed your understanding of greatness?
- Rev. Prince said, **“Jesus could have demanded a throne. Instead, He carried a cross. Real greatness serves.”** What does this statement reveal about life choices?
- Are you more concerned with recognition or faithfulness?
- The world measures greatness by position, influence, and recognition. Jesus measures greatness by humility and service. Who has God placed in your life for you to serve?
- True greatness is never found in asking, "Who will serve me?" It is found in asking, "Whom can I serve?" How does serving others shape your character? What practical act of service can you offer someone today?

Make this declaration in faith: *“I choose the path of humility. Like Jesus, I will serve others with love, faithfulness, and joy.”*

August 7: Leading by Serving

Read John 13:14–15.

- Rev. Prince Mensah said, **“Leadership is not demonstrated by how many people serve you. Leadership is demonstrated by how many people you serve.”** What does this statement mean to you?
- What does Jesus' example teach you about true leadership? Are you willing to serve even when no one notices?
- How can humility strengthen your influence? Who needs your encouragement or practical help today?
- What would change if every believer served as Jesus did?

Pray this prayer from a sincere heart: *“Father, give me the heart of a servant. Help me to walk in humility and faithfully serve others as Jesus did. In Jesus' name I pray. Amen.”*

August 8: A Channel of Blessing

Read Genesis 12:2–3.
