

September 26: Faithful with Little

Read Luke 16:10.

- Pastor Whitcomb reminded us, “**God sees money as a TESTIMONY: it is a CHANCE to SHOW.**” What does this statement mean to you?
- What has God entrusted to you in this season?
- Are you faithfully managing the little things? Why does God value faithfulness so highly?
- What area of stewardship needs greater attention? How can you honor God with what you already have?

Make this declaration aloud: *“I choose to be faithful in every assignment God gives me. I will honor Him with the little, trusting Him with the increase.”*

September 27: True Prosperity

Read Luke 16:10–13.

- Pastor Whitcomb concluded his sermon by reminding us, “**How you handle the MONEY God gives you today is the same way you will handle vast WEALTH should God give that to you tomorrow.**” What does this statement mean to you?
- How would you define true prosperity? What “true riches” does God desire to entrust to His people?
- How has this week's study changed your view of money? What practical step of stewardship will you take this week?
- How can your finances reflect your devotion to Christ?

Prayer: *Ask God to shape your heart according to His definition of prosperity. Pray that you will faithfully steward His blessings, pursue the true riches of His Kingdom, and use all He has entrusted to you for His glory.*



Daily Devotional for THE VALUE OF MONEY

Here is a Daily Devotional to enable you to make the most out of this sermon. You may use it for your personal growth or discuss it together in your Life Group.

September 21: Who Is Your Master?

Read Luke 16:13.

- What spoke to you the most from the sermon “**THE VALUE OF MONEY**”? How would what you heard impact your view of money?
- What does today's Scripture reveal about the danger of divided loyalty?
- In what ways can money subtly become a master? What decisions reveal where your heart truly is?
- How can you keep Christ at the center of your financial decisions?
- What practical step can you take to ensure God remains first in your life?
- **Prayer:** *“Heavenly Father, help me love You above everything else. Guard my heart from anything that competes for Your place. Teach me to honor You with every resource You entrust to me. I ask this in Jesus’ name. Amen.”*

September 22: More Isn't More

Read Ecclesiastes 5:10.

- Pastor Whitcomb reminded us: "**Beware! MORE THINGS won't make you more happy.**" Do you agree with this statement? Why or why not?
- Is there ever a reasonable price to pay for material gain? For example, is it worth a sleepless night? Is it worth spending less time with your family or friends?
- Where do people commonly look for happiness today? Have you ever expected possessions to satisfy your heart?
- What does true contentment look like? How has God faithfully provided for your needs? How can gratitude protect you from greed?

Prayer: *Thank God for His faithful provision in every season. Ask Him to cultivate contentment in your heart and help you find lasting joy in Christ rather than in material possessions.*

September 23: What Is Your Soul Worth?

Read Mark 8:36.

- According to Jesus, what has the greatest value? What can people unintentionally sacrifice while pursuing success?
- How do you protect your relationship with God from worldly pressures?
- What priorities need to change in your life? How can you pursue success without compromising your faith?
- Pastor Whitcomb warned us that "**Beware! BETTER THINGS won't make things better.**" Never sacrifice your faith, your family, your integrity, or your calling in pursuit of temporary gain.

Prayer: *Pray that God will help you value eternal treasures above temporary success. Ask Him to strengthen you to pursue His Kingdom without compromising your faith, integrity, or calling.*

September 24: Blessed to Bless

Read Genesis 12:2–3.

- Pastor Whitcomb shared this powerful truth about money: "**The WEALTH of my values is more important than the value of my WEALTH.**" What does this statement mean to you?
- What blessings has God entrusted to your care? How can you use your resources to bless someone this week?
- In what ways can generosity reflect God's character? Are you viewing your possessions as God's provision or your own achievement? What does it mean to be a channel of blessing rather than an owner?

Make this declaration in faith: *"God has blessed me to be a blessing. I will steward every resource with gratitude and use what He has entrusted to me for His glory and the good of others."*

September 25: Money Reveals the Heart

Read Deuteronomy 8:16.

- How has God provided for you throughout your life? What attitudes toward money does God want to change in you?
- Why is humility essential in times of blessing? How does remembering God's faithfulness build trust? What practical way can you acknowledge God as your Provider today?
- God often uses money as a mirror to reveal what is happening in our hearts. Success can tempt us toward pride, while lack can tempt us toward fear. How has this teaching from Pastor Whitcomb shaped your view of money? Are you struggling with pride or fear? Take time today to reflect on your financial decisions. Pay attention to how you spend your money.

Pray this prayer in faith: *"Lord Jesus, keep my heart humble in every season. Help me remember that everything I have comes from You. Teach me to trust You as my faithful Provider. Amen."*
