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2023 STATE OF THE CHURCH ADDRESS Dr. James Marocco

Genesis 41:14-16, 37-41 NKJV

We live in two realities-the physical and spiritual. The physical, as you know, is time and space and Spiritual reality is eternal. The interesting thing about those two realities is that they affect each other. We can do things in the physical realm that affect the eternal and things in the eternal that affect the physical. This becomes very clear in the story of Joseph. At 17 years old, certain things happened that brought an intersection of those two realities in Joseph's life.

Firstly, Joseph is despised by his brothers. He didn't hide things and on one occasion he was asked by his father to go and work with his halfbrothers, and they did some bad things. Joseph reported it to his father and, of course, they despised him.

Secondly, Jacob loved Joseph more than all the other brothers and made him a special coat. Jacob declared by that coat that he favored Joseph more than the other sons. He treated him like the first born and gave him the special coat that recognized Josephs leadership. He was loved in his father's eyes but this caused his brothers to despise him even more.

Thirdly, Joseph had two dreams. These dreams were not just pizza at night kind of dreams. God was speaking to him and he knew it. In one dream he and his brothers were out gathering the wheat sheaves and his stack of wheat stood up. All of his brothers' sheaves bowed down to his sheaf. The second dream of the sun, moon and stars show the 11 stars bowing down to him as well. By this time, the brothers not only despised him-they hated him. Jacob, his father, asked Joseph to go and give a report on his brothers. When they saw him, they took him, threw him into a well and sold him as a slave to Egypt. Then they deceived their father saying that Joseph was killed by a wild beast. The intersection starts between physical and eternal with the two God-given dreams that Joseph openly spoke about.

In chapter 39 there's a phrase that's used five times, "the Lord was with Joseph." In fact, in verse 23 it states. "The Lord was with him and whatever he did the Lord made it prosper" revealing the intersection of the eternal and physical. Joseph ends up as a slave, and then ends up in prison falsely accused by his slave master's wife. However, while he's in prison, something very unusual happens when the cup bearer and the baker of the pharaoh are also thrown in prison. They both had dreams and Joseph accurately interpreted those dreams. In three days the dreams were clearly lived out--the cup bearer was restored to his position and the baker was executed. Of course, Joseph knowing that they could possibly be a means out, asked the cup bearer to remember him, because he knew the cup bearer would be restored.

Two years passed since the time that those dreams were interpreted, and the cup bearer had forgotten Joseph. It's a moment where the impossible becomes a reality, the intersection between the world in which we live and the world that is unseen. In the moment that Joseph is in prison, pharaoh has a dream, and no one can interpret it. It's at that moment that the cupbearer remembered the Hebrew in prison who can interpret dreams. Pharaoh desperately wanting to know the meaning of the two dreams that he

had, sent for Joseph. At that moment Joseph is elevated because he interprets the dream and gives wise advice as to what to do. The story of those two dreams was simply that Egypt was going to have seven years of great prosperity and then a famine for seven years. The question was how do we prevent everyone from dying during the famine? Joseph gave wise advice, take 20% of everything that is grown during the time of wonderful bounty and store it and have a manager that manages it all for you. In that position God uses Joseph profoundly to not only save the Egyptians from starvation, but save his family as well.

I want you to understand the power of this. Joseph's story is really a type of Christ. Joseph actually lived and literally did what is said here in scripture. But just as Joseph saved the life of his family, the lives of the Egyptians, and others in that area, so Jesus came to save us. Both suffered--both were triumphant. When Joseph came out of prison and came into the court of the pharaoh we see a picture of resurrection just as Jesus died for our sins and rose again. But not only did Joseph save the life of the Egyptians and his family, but he fulfilled God's purpose for his life. Think about this for a moment. God, who is over all time, had a boy born to the wife that Jacob loved. That boy grew up in a very dysfunctional family, almost all the people in the Bible were born in dysfunctional families. That is no excuse for God's purpose not to be fulfilled in our life.

Joseph's life had a purpose where God elevated Joseph in one moment of time, moved him from the prison to the palace, moved him from being a nobody to being the second most powerful person in all of Egypt. God tends to do that to many people throughout the Bible.

Take Moses for example. Moses was shepherding sheep for his fatherin-law in the middle of nowhere when suddenly God bursts in on the scene in a fiery bush--a bush that did not burn but was on fire. That moment to shifted the life of Moses from being a shepherd of sheep and goats to being a deliverer of 2 million people out of Egypt's bondage. Moses became one of the greatest prophets in the Bible and literally lead them from Egypt to Canaan, the promised land.

In the book of Judges, Gideon is threshing wheat in a wine press. You don't normally do that in a wine press. Essentially a wine press is a big tub and he was in there trying to get a little bit of grain for his family because the Midianites would come in during harvest and take their grain. An Angel appears and says, "You're a great warrior" to which Gideon replies, "Give me a break. I'm the least of the least of the least." Suddenly God broke into time. Eternity came into time, into Gideon's world and said, "You're not called to be a scavenger of a few pieces of grain. I'm calling you to be a victorious general to deliver my people" and with 300 men, Gideon killed thousands of Midianites.

We see the life of David. In one moment, he's elevated. Yes, he was anointed as a young boy-- probably around 12 or so. The reason he hadn't been invited to the meal with Samuel was because he was a shepherd boy out in the middle of the fields. He was not seen as a man, and this was a meeting for men. He wasn't there and so Samuel said, "Well, do you have another son?" "Oh yeah, I've got a kid over here who's shepherding sheep." "Well, we won't eat until he comes." Samuel anointed David as king, but it wasn't until he stood up for God and faced Goliath on the battlefield and killed him, that the moment happened. It was like a hand came out of eternity, took that stone, and killed Goliath the giant. At that moment, David was elevated into a position of tremendous influence that finally led him to fulfill the purpose of God to be king of Israel.

I always take things extremely seriously when I preach the state of the church address and stand before this entire church worldwide. About a month ago just in my normal reading and praying and seeking the Lord, I came to this point that I read to you of Joseph being elevated. What caught my attention was not that he was elevated. I've read that a lot of times, but it was something else that caught my attention. In the first Different pastors preached from different denominations and fellowships. We did it outside. The very next day, bang they tried to shut us down. God had spoken to me to begin to do our feeding program on Sundays about a month or two before the total shut down. It was the fact that we were feeding so many people every Sunday that allowed us to even have our services outside, even when they determined we have to park

verse of chapter 41it says, "Then it came to pass at the end of two years that pharaoh had a dream." It was two years after he had interpreted the dream of the cup bearer. He was still in prison. Suddenly it hit me, what's happened in the last two years to the church? The church was hit with COVID. COVID was not just a nice pandemic that happened to touch the world. It was an attack by the devil to destroy the church. I've said that many times. Churches across our nation have lost 30 to 40% of their people. Some of them will never return.

What was all this about? It was about testing the very nature of our nation whether the constitution of the United States would still stand during a pandemic. Praise God for our Supreme Court who had values and believed in the constitution. It has not always been that way. Freedom of religion is enshrined in the constitution, and live under a Bill of Rights that cannot be automatically taken away. People ask me why I fought so hard to keep the church open? When we couldn't meet inside, we went outside. The Lord spoke to me and said, "This year on Good Friday, rather than just have your pastors preach, invite pastors from the entire island to come and share the seven last words of Jesus." We packed the entire parking lot with cars. A Catholic priest shared on Mary (I knew he would choose Mary).

end to end throughout our property but I couldn't care less if it's this way or that way as long as I get to preach the gospel. I thank God for leaders that were willing to allow us to meet. But understand very clearly, there are two realms at work--the physical and the spiritual. There was a demonic attempt to destroy the church. I'm thankful that we're still here and I'm thankful that despite it all, God grew our church.

When I saw that two-year time span, of all of a sudden, I realized something. We're right in that same framework--the attempt of the enemy to keep Joseph in prison; attempt to lock him up so that the will of God could not be fulfilled. The enemy doesn't know everything, but he does have some idea, "God may want to use Joseph because everywhere he goes he's successful and prosperous. I'd better raise up some crazy lady to accuse him of something that didn't happen. I better get him in prison. I've got to lock him up because if I don't, we're in trouble." That's exactly what the enemy of our souls did to the church in America and around the world. But I've got good news. There will be an elevation that will sweep the church.

The word of the Lord for this year is ELEVATION. It is time for elevation. When the enemy comes in like a flood the Spirit of the Lord will raise up a standard! Some of us have been so beat up by the devil that when difficult times come, we think that the rest of life is going to be like that. The enemy is sure to remind us of all the pain. But there's coming a time for elevation. That time is now! God elevated Joseph into the position to fulfill His purpose, to save His covenant people. God posi-

tioned Joseph for elevation because of three things. The first thing we see was that Joseph was holy. In chapter 39 Joseph says a profound statement when Potiphar's wife tried to seduce him. Joseph was a good-looking young man and could have easily yielded to his own personal lust and the lust of that woman but he says. "How then can I do this great wickedness and sin against God?" People steal and don't realize they're sinning against God. There are people that look at stuff that they shouldn't be looking at and they're sinning against God. The eternal realm and the physical realm intersect. When we sin, weren't not just hurting ourselves we're sinning against God.

Joseph could be trusted by God to fulfill his purpose. If he had sinned with this woman he would have aborted God's plan and if he ever got into a position of great leadership, he would destroy everything. If we can't handle little things, we will not be able to handle big things. If you can't even contain your own lust how will God trust you when you are elevated? I get extremely nervous for people in ministry that don't control their fleshly appetites. We have to get out of that pig pen and start walking holy.

Secondly, Joseph persevered in serving. He served his brains out under Potiphar and even when he was thrown in prison, he ended up serving there. He saw himself as a servant. There's an elevation God wants to bring to you greater than you know and he will fulfill His purpose, but, if you stop serving, you stop His hand from being able to use you as He wants.

Joseph walked humbly before the Lord. In 41:16 pharaoh says, "I've heard it said of you that you can understand a dream and interpret it." So Joseph answered pharaoh, "It is not in me. God will give pharaoh an answer of peace." God will reveal himself through you if He is the center of your life, not your own self. God will not elevate us if we are self- centered! Sometimes we miss God's best for us because we're so into ourselves that God can't use us anymore. We must humble ourselves so that God will elevate us in his time.

Joseph used his gifts. God gave Joseph two dreams when he was 17 years

are still five years in which they will be neither plowing nor harvesting. And God sent me before you to preserve a posterity for you and the earth, and to save your lives by a great deliverance." It was God who set it all up so that God would be glorified. The most important thing in life is to know you are in the center of

old. He literally saw God's hand on him in the interpreting of dreams. In the prison, God revealed the interpretation of two dreams. Joseph could have refused to interpret the dreams, because he was in a difficult place. However, it was a gift God gave him and he used it. Some people have gifts in music and are sitting there not using it. Some have gifts in administration and can organize things but are not using it for the Lord. Some have gifts of caring for people and love people deeply but just keep it all to themselves. One day you must give an account for the gifts God gave you and what you did with them. God's not asking you to do what anyone else does. He gave YOU gifts. What have you done with them? There are some people who have a gift of mercy. I have one of them on my staff--Pastor Daniel Wine. He has a great gift of mercy. He quit his job as an electrician making a very good salary and asked me if he could come on my staff? I told him I couldn't pay him and he said, "That's OK. God's called me to reach a needy group of people on this island and I weep over them." Shame on people who have a gift and don't use it.

Lastly, Joseph glorified God in everything he did. In Genesis 45:5-7 Joseph says, "For God sent me before you to preserve life. For these two years the famine has been in the land, and there God's will; giving Him glory in everything you do. 2023 will be a year where God will elevate King's. It will be a year when there will be personal elevation and family elevation. It will be a year when things that seem to never be able to go right will start to turn right. Prodigals will come home.

As elevation comes, remember the life of Joseph. Don't get prideful. Even though he was

elevated, Joseph saw it all as a marvelous gift from God. For the past 43 years we have seen the gift of God flowing through His people. God has raised up an army of people hungering for Him with the same sensitivity to the voice of the Lord, and together this vision will be fulfilled. It is God who is at work in the eternal moving into time and space through people like you and me, people who will walk before the Lord holy, righteous, and pure. Humble people using their God-given gifts, persevering in serving and doing what God's called us to do, giving glory to God. It's time for ELEVATION.

Sharon and I are grateful to the Lord for the opportunity to see a new church being born in Italy!





Jn June 6-11, 2023 King's Molokai celebrated its 40th year anniversary. In 1983 God spoke to Dr. Marocco and said, "If the Mayor of Maui County can be the Mayor of three islands, you can be the Pastor of those three islands." Those three islands are Maui, Molokai, and Lanai. At that time, the only churches under Dr. Marocco were on Maui. No extensions existed outside of Maui. God spoke to Dr. Marocco to start on the island of Molokai. It was a huge step of faith, obedience and sacrifice. Dr. Marocco led the way with the congregation on Maui to take those steps. On May 15, 1983 Molokai held its first service. Dr. Marocco, Pastor Colleen and a few others would leave Maui after the two morning services with huge crowds, flying on a little 9 seater single prop engine, to a service on Molokai to minister to a handful of people, then return to Maui for the evening service. This continued for an entire year, until God raised up Pastors to continue the work.

Little did everyone know that this act of faith, obedience and sacrifice would be the gateway to what God is doing through King's today. Once Dr. Marocco was the Pastor of Maui County, the stage was set, the door was open leading to where we are now and where we are going. Years later God expanded the vision past Maui County when King's was established in Honoka'a, Big Island, then Kauai, Alaska, Japan, Philippines, the Pacific Rim and the rest of the world.

Since 1983, there have been other Pastors that moved to Molokai to assist in the work. Pastor Albert and Minister Linda Kamau, Pastor Steve and Minister Vickie Franks, Pastor Prudencio and Minister Julie Quinsay, Pastor Earl and Jana Thurner, Pastor Mike & Sheila Zarle, Pastors Daniel and Karen Bracken, and currently Pastors Robert and Lani Sahagun, as well as many others who put their hand to the plow.

As 40 years represents a generation, we are excited to see the next generation arise. As the President of King's, Pastors Josh and Shannon Marocco have stepped up as the next leaders taking Hawaii to new levels thus allowing Dr. Marocco and Pastor Colleen to further expand their reach now as Global Senior Pastors.

During the week-long celebration from Tuesday, June 6, to Sunday June 11, we had powerful services every night with Pastor Earl Thurner, Pastors Daniel and Karen Bracken, Pastor Prudencio Quinsay and Pastor Albert and Minister Linda Kamau. Joining us were Pastor Anne Fujii, Pastors Jakob and Leah Barrientos, Pastor Melani Akuna and Polynesian dancers from Oahu and Minister Brandon Miguel. Finishing the celebration was our Global Senior Pastor Dr. Marocco and Pastor Colleen on Sunday Morning at the old "Pau Hana Inn", because our main facility would not hold all who attended.

The celebration continued with a fabulous luncheon prepared by our

WE MARYEL AT GOD! By Pastor Gil and Minister Rosie Nantes

God has been moving mightily in King's Eagle River since its launch in 2016. Pastor Gil and Minister Rosi Nantes started the church in their house along with a few individuals and families. God has expanded us this past year with rapid growth and multiplication in families and volunteers. We marvel at what God has been doing and continues to do.

Dusty and Juby Filemoni's journey to healing and freedom is one major testimony. In 2016, they had divorce papers drawn when their aunt, a member of King's Antioch called them and said, "there is a King's in Wasilla now." They decided to try one last attempt to save their marriage. After their first visit, they received a connect follow up call from Pastor Gil and Rosi Nantes from Kings Wasilla. That was the beginning of a ripple effect of testimonies that generated an exponential wave of families and individuals saved and transformed and are now serving faithfully in the house of the Lord.

Dusty was diagnosed with PTSD and Chronic Depression. He had constant lumbar and spine pain and became addicted to Oxycodone and a growing battle with alcoholism. Dusty was also struggling with severe explosive rage issues which caused blackouts. God intervened at the most impeccable moment. Juby, his wife, had heard about the Men's encounter in King's Wasilla, so she registered Dusty, packed his bags and told him that Dr. David Ammon is picking him up for a "service" in Wasilla. Dusty accepted the invitation unaware that it would be a 2-day men's event until they were halfway to their destination. Disappointed as he was, it was too late to turn around. That night in the Men's encounter, Dusty said, "I felt the Lord tell me to press into Him." When he did, Pastor Daniel Bracken prayed for him to receive the baptism of the Holy Spirit. The demonic oppression was broken. It was the first time in years that Dusty had a peaceful night's rest with no nightmares. They plugged into a life group at the Nantes home in Eagle River and followed through in becoming members of KC. Their marriage was restored and they started serving in King's Eagle River as volunteer staff. Dusty says, "I am grateful for Pastor Gil and Minister Rosi for their love for people. I do not know where I would be if it weren't for their love and leadership. I'll never forget the night Pastor Gil showed up with Minister Rosi at midnight at my house to pray for us".

In March 2022, the Filemoni's transitioned from leading the Youth ministry to starting Transformation. It started as a life group, but with growth came a need for a service and in February 2023, we launched the Transformation service and has now grown to 30 to 40 attendees. Family members have reconciled, marriages restored, people set free from alcoholism and substance abuse, violent rage, healing over physical illnesses, and so much more. Niagai joined Transformation and is a consistent member. For many years doctors could not pinpoint exactly the cause of the severe bleeding that constantly taunted her, and many medications were prescribed. When she joined Transformation she grew in God mentally, physically, and spiritually. She answered an altar call for healing during a midweek service in which Minister Rosi touched her stomach and prayed. She felt a warm sensation over her body and instantly she knew the bleeding had stopped, "God healed me that night!"

These are a few testimonies of what God continues to do in King's Eagle River as He has positioned us for a greater outpouring of the Holy Spirit to impact the city and to release restoration into the community, one family at a time.

WRITE A SONG! By King's Collective Team





he word 'Amen' means, 'I agree' or 'let it be done, let it be so in my life'. What is being declared here is not just something that we hear, but something that we need to apply and live out. Many times in church we become conditioned to say 'Amen" when we like what is being said. However, it's so much more than that, it is agreeing to apply everything that was said.

Paul the apostle wants us to understand the power of the Amen. It's coming into agreement with God's promises and aligning our life with the word, purposes, and will of God. Too often we live at a distance from the promises that God has for us. We see other people stepping into their destiny, getting healed, being blessed, but we keep ourselves at a distance from all the promises and all the yes' of God. That must change.

First, realize that everything is predicated upon Jesus Christ. The promises of God are all found in Jesus Christ. It's not apart from Him--it is in Him. The promises of God are revealed in Christ, sustained in Christ, accessed in Christ. Everything truly is substantiated in a relationship with Jesus and a relationship with His word. There is not one promise from the Old Testament to the New Testament that is apart from Christ. Many people want the promises, but they don't

want covenant. They want promises but not relationship.

We also must understand that the devil knows the power of agreement. If he can get us to agree with the problems, circumstances, lies, and bad reports, we then allow him to have authority in those areas. A few years ago, my grandfather was 98 years old. We were in Colorado with our whole family and went whitewater rafting. It was so much fun. The guide gave us instructions before we took off, "If I give you this command, I want you to tuck your feet into the tube and hold on for dear life. Don't try and bounce, don't try and put your arms out. There's nothing you can do to control any bit of circumstance. Just kind of tuck in and hold on." Coming into agreement is just like being on a whitewater raft in the rapids. Whatever you come into agreement with, you give permission to take you. There is a fight for agreement. We've got to contend to get our emotions, our passions, and our minds in agreement with God.

Secondly, we have got to deal with the fallacy of tribulation. We often believe the lie, that battles and hardships are a reflection of our spiritual state. Just because we're going through hardship doesn't necessarily mean that we're not in the will of God. Many people mark whether they're in the will of God when

everything is perfect-money in the bank, health, and everybody likes me, so I must be in the will of God. Some have the false theology that if people don't like you, if you don't have money, if you're sick, if you're going through problems and circumstances, then your obviously not in the will of God.

If we look at the apostle Paul's life we see in almost every city he went to he faced persecution and problems. He was beaten, kicked out of almost every city, stoned to death, and wrote about an affliction that he had. Some theologians believe that affliction was residue from blindness he experienced when he encountered Jesus, or a physical injury and constant pain from being severely beaten, multiple times. This would have been a reason for Luke (author of Luke and Acts), who was a physician, to travel with him in his later years. Paul called it the "thorn in his flesh." Some people believe that it was obviously sin in Paul's life because of the "thorn in his flesh" persecution, and even poverty. That's wrong!

I do believe that there are direct results from sin in our life. I believe sin can hinder the blessing and the anointing. However, it is imperative to understand that just because difficult times come, we can still be in the middle of God's will. Paul knew that our perspective matters. We can't allow the presence of hardship to cause us to abandon the promises of God. Many have abandoned their call and their destiny because things are hard, concluding that it must not be God, but we must determine our position, not based on circumstance, but on relationship-intimacy and proximity with Christ. That's how we gain confidence. We don't get confidence because we know scripture or have better church attendance than someone else. Our confidence is established in our relationship, intimacy, and proximity with Christ.

God has precious promises available for us. Our text says. "All His promises are 'yes' in Christ. Ephesians 1:18 says, " I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which He has called you, the riches of His glorious inheritance in His holy people, and His incomparably great power for us who believe. That power is the same as the mighty strength He exerted when He raised Christ from the dead and seated Him at His right hand in the heavenly realms.

This passage reveals God's mighty strength far above all rule, all authority, all power, and all dominion in every time and place within the name of Jesus. If all you have is the name of Jesus, you have enough. We are saved, healed, delivered, and set free by the name of Jesus. Without Jesus Christ we can't even receive the Holy Spirit. It is only Jesus who washes and cleanses us so that we could be vessels of honor for the Holy Spirit to flow through. We must understand the magnitude of what we carry-- the power, the authority, the dominion of the name of Jesus. We are more than victorious conquerors through Christ.

The promises of God, the yes' of God, are many. First of these yes', is forgiveness. I John 1:9 states, "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and cleanse us of all unrighteousness." We have a 'yes' of forgiveness. Second, we have a 'yes' of cleansing. II Corinthians 5:17. "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new." He'll never reject our repentance. Jesus will never look at us and say, "I can't forgive you." If we confess our sins, He will forgive.

Third we receive the 'yes' of acceptance. Hebrews 4:14-16 reveals, "Therefore, since

we have a great high priest who ascended has into heaven, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold firmly to the faith we profess. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to empathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we areyet he did not sin. Let us then approach God's

throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need." Not only does God accept our repentance but His mercy and grace are generous--the agape love of God which flows unconditionally. We as flawed human beings are incapable of paying God back in the fullness of what His grace and mercy is.

Fourthly, we agree with the 'yes' of supply. Philippians 4:19 states, "And

my God will meet all your needs according to the riches of his glory in Christ Jesus." Christ is also the 'yes' for your supply. I'm not saying that God is your sugar daddy. Don't drive by a parking lot and stretch your hands and pray for an Escalade. We need to declare the blessing of God, but we need to first understand the supply of God. God will never ever call you to something and not supply what is needed. He did it for the Apostle Paul and Mother Theresa. Mother Teresa was called to India, as were my grandparents. It was rough, hard, and dirty. They knew that they weren't going to live in a mansion and be wealthy but obeyed God and had everything they needed. God supplied for every part of the calling. Many people think that supply and prosperity mean that we get the biggest home or the nicest car, but this passage declares that God is not obligated to supply every desire but God obligates for the call. If he calls you to something, not only is he going to give you the financial supply, but the anointing, strength, power and the grace to fulfill it.

The fifth place of agreement God gives is the 'yes' of healing. Isaiah

"THE PROMISES OF GOD, THE 'YES' OF GOD, ARE MANY".

53:4-5 says, "Surely he took up our pain and bore our suffering, yet we considered him punished by God, stricken by him, and afflicted. But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on him, and by his wounds we are healed." Some read that as only a spiritual healing, but they're limiting what Jesus Christ did on the cross. Christ broke the curse for

every iniquity and every infirmity. His death and resurrection broke the curse of sin. The Apostle James revels that healing was for the church in James 5:14, "Is anyone among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord. And the prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise him up." One of the greatest commands Jesus gave us is to lay hands on the sick and see them recover. "These signs shall follow those who believe (Mk 16:17)." It's association with Jesus and belief in Him that enables His power to follow through us. Some theologians claim the heresy that miracles died with the apostles, but more than apostles did miracles. Stephen wasn't an apostle, he served at the church and many miracles flowed through him. He was the first Christian martyr. Philip, who was called an evangelist, did miracles all around town. Phillip's daughters, who weren't even called prophets, prophesied. There are lists of non-Apostles throughout the New Testament that performed miracles through the Power of Jesus. Miracles weren't attached to the apostles, they were attached to the name of Jesus. The name of Jesus is still as powerful and potent as it was 2000 years ago. Jesus has not changed one bit. He is the same yesterday, today, and forever. If He was a healer then, He's a healer now. If He was a savior then, He's a savior now. If He was a deliverer then, He's a deliverer now! Don't let the devil lie to you. Don't believe everything you hear online. They get paid every time someone watches or subscribes to their nonsense. They say crazy nonsense just to get people to watch them and are spreading heresy around the world. Jesus is our healer of broken hearts, broken bodies, and broken minds. He heals every aspect of our life.

The sixth agreement we see is the 'yes' of destiny. Philippians 1:6 Paul encourages, "Being confident of this, that He who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus." I know some of us get discouraged because we don't see

movement in our desired purpose. We don't see things happening quickly, so we get derailed, but God is not going to abandon us. He's not a neglectful God; He's for us. We may not see what He's doing right now, but when we continue to believe God for miracles and hold true to His promises, we discover that God purposely hides what He's doing to perpetuate faith in our lives. If we see everything God's doing along the way, then we wouldn't need faith. The Bible says without faith it's impossible to please God (Heb. 11:6). There are moments that God intentionally hides what He's doing so that we must wake up daily with a new measure of faith. In the midst of the daily faith walk remember that God is faithful to complete his promise. If He called us, He will work on us, and together we can fulfill the destiny and call of God on our lives.

The Seventh "Amen", is the 'yes' of His Spirit. Luke 11:13 says, "If you then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!" The Holy Spirit helps us in our weakness and is the key to holiness in our life. We have access to the Holy Spirit not based on our works but through faith in Christ. We don't have to run a mile or a good giving record. Many people think we have to be worthy, or live a certain way, to be filled with and empowered by the Holy Spirit. We do need to be vessels of honor as that how much he moves through us, but God's ability supersedes our inability. Just ask, "Holy Spirit, I need you right now. I don't have strength. I'm weak," and by God's grace He will send the Spirit to help us in our weakness (Rm 8:26).

When I was the Youth Pastor of about 350 youth, there were many days of big problems and issues. One of the problems with the students continued until I felt emaciated, spiritually and physically. I was lying on the ground in our Prayer Chapel with zero strength and cried out, "Lord, help me. I have to preach in an hour, and I have nothing to say. I don't even want to preach; I don't even want to be here." I began praying in the Holy Ghost. even I didn't know what I was saying. Even in that moment the devil spoke lies to me, "Praying in tongues doesn't work," but I just continued to pray in the Holy Ghost. Soon strength came to me, and I went from my stomach to my knees. As I continued to pray in the Holy Spirit, I went from my knees to my feet. Then I slowly began to pace which slowly increased to a march. Suddenly strength begin to fill me. My body got strengthened; my spirit got strengthened; the Holy Spirit began to quicken to me on what to do and what to say. There's no other explanation than the power of the Holy Spirit. In my time of need, my time of weakness, the Holy Spirit helped me. The Holy Spirit is a 'yes' for you. He's a promise for you to help you in every moment of your life.

The promises of God are yes and amen, forgiveness, cleansing, acceptance, supply, healing, destiny, and the Holy Spirit are all waiting for us to claim them. I encourage you to step out and claim God's promises today. Speak the 'Amen' to the glory of God!

Puppets in the Park is a way we have reached out into the community to preach the Good News to families. This outreach involves many people using their gifts and talents.

How to do a Park Outreach

1.Choose a park in your city or town that people of your community use often. (Check with the park and rec department if you need a permit)2. Make a job list: -Outreach Director

-Prayer team

-Loading team: (people with trucks to

bring everything to and from the park) -Generator person (brings generators and keeps them running. Returns generators)

-Registration Team (get everybody's info for Free drawing and follow up)

-Greeters / Connectors

-Sound -Emcee

-Performers (dance)

-Puppeteers

-Puppete

-Preacher -Altar team

-Gospel tract and invite to

church (make & print)

-Cook & team to serve food

-Prizes (family friendly: pizza card,

trampoline park, small prizes, too) -Purchaser: food, prizes -Follow up (organize visitation follow up)

Tips for success!

Get the word out. Let people know what you're going to do, invite them. Social media, yard signs, flyers, etc.

Feed the whole family. We found that if we feed the whole family, whole families come. Make your prizes family friendly, not just for kids. Small prizes are fine, but also give family prizes (like a gift card for the family to go out to pizza or to an amusement). Make sure your registration has name slots for parents & kids, birthdates, address, phone #. It is super important is to ask what church they attend so you follow up only on those who don't attend church. Preach the Gospel, Give an altar call, Salvation prayer, Gospel tract as they leave, and invite them to CHURCH.


On April 15th, we did a fundraiser at the nearby US Military Base's, Friendship
