*I PETER 2:13-15; 18-25

13 Submit yourselves for the Lord's sake to every authority instituted among men: whether to the king, as the supreme authority, 14 or to governors, who are sent by him to punish those who do wrong and to commend those who do right. 15 For it is God's will that by doing good you should silence the ignorant talk of foolish men. 18 Slaves, submit yourselves to your masters with all respect, not only to those who are good and considerate, but also to those who are harsh. 19 For it is commendable if a man bears up under the pain of unjust suffering because he is conscious of God. 20 But how is it to your credit if you receive a beating for doing wrong and endure it? But if you suffer for doing good and you endure it, this is commendable before God. 21 To this you were called, because Christ suffered for you, leaving you an example, that you should follow in his steps. 22 "He committed no sin, and no deceit was found in his mouth." 23 When they hurled their insults at him, he did not retaliate; when he suffered, he made no threats. Instead, he entrusted himself to him who judges justly.

24 He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, so that we might die to sins and live for righteousness; by his wounds you have been healed. 25 For you were like sheep going astray, but now you have returned to the Shepherd and Overseer of your souls.



SERMON NOTES

A Difficult Teaching I Peter 2:13-15; 18-25

Intro.

Big Idea: As Jesus-followers we are to honor and respect all legitimate authority.

- I. The scriptural word "submit" does not mean slavish obedience.
 - -The Greek word *hupotasso* literally means "to arrange under."
- II. Our submission to authority is based on God's ordained structures for society.
 - 1. These structures are for our good.
 - Jesus honored and respected them in his days on earth.
- III. Our autonomous sinful nature causes us to naturally struggle giving honor and respect to authorities.
- IV. We are empowered to do God's will as we remember how Jesus gave himself for us.
