Dear HOPE Friends,

Last year, in this letter, I spoke about our four V30 initiatives: REACH, GROW, PLANT, and GO. These efforts to pursue our mission by reaching families, growing leaders, planting churches, and going far and wide are coming to fruition in exciting ways. Our local and global reach is also growing significantly as we have the privilege of sharing Christ through partners in Richmond and around the world.

So it's interesting to me that, along with this growth over the last year, I have also read that people are losing interest in religion, faith, and the church. I understand the statistics, but at the level of the human heart, I don't believe it. Yes, I think it's possible that older cultural versions of faith are diminishing, but I am convinced that sincere and committed faith is growing. I am also convinced that human beings are hungry for God – if they can just find a safe place to explore and ask their questions. If we can be that kind of place, I feel confident that hungry hearts and souls are all around us. I saw this in the amazing baptism service we had in September, when 31 people were baptized! It was such a joyful night!

I hope that you are also aware that we are seeing something beautiful happening in our day. The younger generation among us, referred to as Gen Z, is expressing a hunger, sincerity, and devotion to Jesus that hasn't been seen in a long time. Barna Research has written a lot about this in its "State of the Church 2025." Some HOPErs in their late 50s and older have said to me that this reminds them of the spiritual hunger among teenagers and college students in the 1970s and 80s. This hunger is sincere and passionate and unpretentious. All things which bear authentic marks of the Holy Spirit. I'm very encouraged by this!

Okay, if you've read this far, you might also be thinking, "This is terrific, but we have a growth problem around here – is anyone thinking about it?" Yes! For the last year, we have had numerous teams working on plans to consider expansion. It's a tricky endeavor because adding to our campus is like working on a challenging jigsaw puzzle. But we are getting close with plans that our architects and staff have been working on through weekly meetings all year. Current drafts are for a phased approach in a long-range plan with plans for some scalable steps happening ASAP, starting in three to six months or so.

In closing, as you read through this report, I hope it makes you first want to pray and thank the Lord... that we get to be a part of what He's doing. When HOPE started 28 years ago, we frequently said,

"The Best is Yet to Come." I still believe it.

Through a model of discipleship and small groups, Hope Students offers 6th-12th graders relationships and places where they feel known and loved by adult leaders who care about them and want them to grow in Christ.

#### an impact beyond campus

"A student from Randolph-Macon has been coming to our college small group for the past few weeks, and one week, he came to Sunday morning church for the first time. He and some friends were sitting in the row behind me. After the service, I turned around to talk to them, and he looked a little red in the eyes, but he was smiling. His first words to me were, 'I've never experienced anything like that before.'

It almost caught me off guard because I'm so used to statements like that coming from a student at Winter Weekend, or Passion Conference, or a worship night. It was just an incredibly sweet reminder that it's not just in the huge camp moments or special worship nights where Jesus meets us.

On what felt like a normal Sunday for me, God did something new and unique in him, and I'm so grateful that new college students are seeing the heart of Christ in this place. This college student's soul has been hungry for Jesus for a long time, and on a normal Sunday, I think his soul caught a glimpse of what it's been longing for."



## grow leaders

We seek to raise up the next generation of church leaders through discipleship, internships, and our HCML resident program.

This summer, we welcomed 30 interns to campus, who came alongside us across multiple ministries.

The Hope Center for Missional Leadership (HCML) expanded this year to include four residents across missional, students, college + young adults, and pastoral ministries.



Through our Care Ministry Triage Team, those facing difficulty are connected with helpful resources as well as ordained elders and deacons who provide prayer and spiritual support. We also come alongside families in seasons of loss, offering memorial services that honor their loved ones and point to the hope we have in the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

And in moments of joyful commitment, we celebrate the sacrament of baptism, an outward expression of the inward transformation found in Christ, through monthly infant baptisms and dedications, as well as quarterly baptism and worship nights for individuals taking this step of faith.
