IN 2025 GABC MISSIONS:

- 40+ churches served through teams and gifts
- 24 mission trips
- 236 people trained in evangelism
- 7 of the trips were international to Brazil, Scotland, England, Kenya (2 trips), Colombia, and Mexico
- Engaged with over 100 different churches and ministries in over 30 different countries.
- Over 50 of our GABC Connect Groups were mobilized to engage thousands in our city with the gospel

COMMUNITY OUTREACH:

Easter Outreach:

- Cookies and invites were distributed to over 5,000 teachers, school staff, and first responders in Tyler, Bullard, Chapel Hill, and Whitehouse.
- GABC members handed out over 12,000 door hangers and invites to friends and neighbors across our community.

Block Parties:

- Over 200 people from 18 Connect Groups from our church hosted or helped host a Block party in neighborhoods, schools, and parks of our city.
- 3,000 candy bags with tracts and church invite cards distributed.

• Feed Our Friends:

- 171 members of our church served food, had gospel conversations, and prayed with over 1,000 of our East Texas families.
- St. Paul Children's Services: Distributed 50
 Bibles through outreach efforts. At the summer
 feeding program, 86 volunteers from the Español
 and Tyler campuses served, reaching over 100
 kids.

Disaster Relief:

- Sent volunteers to assist in disaster recovery efforts in several states – Oklahoma (15), Tennessee (2), and California (3).
- Over 50 volunteers from our mobile Shower and Laundry trailer served in both disaster and non-disaster settings.
- Texans on Missions conducted a city-wide cleanup day, during which we removed approximately 1,000 yards of log and limb debris.
- During the Christmas season, we partnered with Church Under the Bridge to serve the homeless community in Tyler, distributing popcorn and other essentials to 140 people

School Outreach:

- Peete Elementary: Provided encouraging cards, lunches, bounce houses, prayer, treats, and volunteers for field day and fall festival.
- Boshears: Donated a specialized trike for students with severe needs.
- Promise Academy: Supplied vans and volunteers for 3 field trips.
- School is Cool: Partnered with the City of Tyler back-to-school program where ministry information and gospel tracts were distributed to 2000+ East Texas.
- Bethesda Health Clinic: 41 volunteers served at Bethesda Health Clinic during GABC Serve Day, and 40 Bibles were donated.

Christian Women's Job Corp:

- 6 Connect Groups served in the form of meals and gifts.
- 11 volunteers served as teachers, mentors and administrative duties.

Men's Prison Ministry:

- Ministered to 1,328 inmates, 50 salvations, and around 20 individuals served.
- Donated 318 pairs of glasses to Calvary Commission to be given to Smith County inmates.



CHURCH PLANTER AND MISSIONARY PRAYER GUIDE

Even more than financial support, our mission partners crave our prayers and encouragement. Below is a list of church planters and missionaries we would love your group to partner with and intentionally pray for. Because the needs of a church planter and missionary are unique, we've included some suggestions of how to pray for these partners. Please contact Missions Associate Stacie Tandy at staciet@gabc.org with any questions or for more information on our GABC Mission partnerships.

How to pray for church planters:

Finances – Church plants often struggle with finances due to small size, high expenses, and lack of regular tithing. Pray that God will provide financial stability so that the pastor and workers can focus on ministry.

Meeting Space – Most church plants do not own a meeting facility and lease space where it is available. Pray that God will provide a consistent place to meet each Sunday that will work with the finances of the church.

Pastor and Family – Pastors of church plants often move away from their immediate family and friends to start the church plant. Pray for encouragement and support for the pastor and their families as they deal with the isolation from family and friends.

How to pray for missionaries:

Safety – Many missionaries are working in areas hostile to the gospel and put their own safety and security at risk each time they share their faith. Pray that the Holy Spirit would go before them and provide protection and peace of mind.

Patience and Perseverance – In many cultures where our missionaries live, ministry fruit is very slow-growing. Relationships may take years to develop because of mistrust and cultural barriers. Pray that the missionary would be affirmed in his/her call and encouraged to stay the course.

Community – Isolation is one of the biggest challenges for a missionary in the field. The feeling of loneliness or being forgotten can weigh heavy and distract from the mission. Pray that the Lord would build a sense of community where they are and that friends, families and partners will be intentional in reaching out to them.

Other ways to pray:

Pray for a close walk with Jesus. Pray for a strong grounding in Christ. Pray for wisdom. Pray for favor in the community. Pray for a deep love for the Lord, the Word and the lost. Pray for physical, emotional and spiritual strength. Pray for holiness and integrity. Pray for the power of the Holy Spirit to lead and guide. Pray for opportunities to share the gospel. Pray for church/team unity.

Pastor Tracy Sullens The Bridge Church Bucksport, Maine

Tracy and his wife Elizabeth stay busy taking care of their five kids (ages 6-14) far from the support of friends and extended family. In addition to pastoring, Tracy works full-time as a Special Education teacher, which gives him greater opportunities to connect with the community.

Beacon Community Church
