DEPARTURE

- *Check in will begin at the Student Center (Tyler Campus) in the SC Foyer on **Sunday night, June 14 at 10:15pm.***
- Place your luggage on your assigned grade-level bus then come inside to complete the check in process.
- Check in with the nurse, if necessary, to deliver any medications.
- BE ON TIME!!
- *Buses will leave promptly at 11pm.*

RETURN

- **Midnight on Friday, June 19,** at the Student Center (Tyler Campus).
- Students will have a lunch and dinner stop along the route. These will be determined with our bus drivers and students will need money for these.
- We will post updates on our social media accounts on the day of travel.

MONEY MATTERS

- Registration fee includes lodging and 11 meals at The Majestic, program fee, transportation and camp t-shirt. Additional cost will be snacks, travel meals and optional souvenirs.
- Students should plan for 2 travel meals and 1 lunch out at Pier Park while at camp (\$40-\$50).
- Upon arrival to PCB, every bus will have the opportunity to go shop for snacks for the week. Meals are provided but if your student would like to have some extra food and drink options in the condo, they are welcome to purchase those.
- Balances must be paid in full by departure date. If you have any questions with regards to your balance, please contact the Student Ministry Office.

ROOMING and BUS ASSIGNMENTS

- Bus assignments will be made by grade and small group placement. Students will be placed in small groups based on their friend requests and grade.
- Room assignments will be based on small groups as well.
- Small Groups and REC assignments will be posted on June 7 at Connect Groups. If any changes need to be made, they must be requested to Meghan Goad that day.
- ****A request does not a guarantee that a change will be made.*

WHAT TO BRING

- Bible (paper, physical Bible)
- Journal and Pen
- Pillow and blanket (if desired), towels for beach/pool.
 - o *Bed linens and shower towels are provided, not outdoor towels*
- Toiletry items, sunscreen, etc.
- Clothes for the week at camp, including REC clothes, swimsuit and Theme Night outfits.
 - o We are continuing to ask students to bring REC clothes that match their teams assigned color. Go all out and get into it! Bring props!
 - o Theme Nights: we want everyone to get into the fun and come dressed to impress each night!
 - Monday – World Cup
 - Tuesday – Beach Camp (Beach Camp Event Shirts)
 - Wednesday – Aliens vs Astronauts (Girls vs Boys)
 - Thursday – Dress for the Wrong Occasion

BEACHCAMP

- o Please see provided Summer Must Haves handout for tips and guidelines on appropriate dress and swimwear.
- **Limit: one suitcase and one carry-on**

WHAT NOT TO BRING

- Alcohol, illegal drugs, weapons, vapes, tobacco, inappropriate clothing, pranking supplies or anything else that would lead to unwise decisions while at camp.
- Be smart about bringing valuables with you to camp. Green Acres will not be responsible for lost or damaged personal items.

SAFETY

- Students will be supervised at all times, including beach time, free-time and while in the dorms/lodge areas.
- Students are not permitted to leave camp property at any time.
- Small groups will travel throughout the day together. No students are allowed to be in the rooms and/or the beach without their leader.
- Lifeguards are not present at the pool or beach area. All camp participants will be made aware daily of applicable flag warnings and beach conditions.

GUIDELINES and MEDICAL RELEASE/CODE OF CONDUCT:

- Please familiarize yourself with all camp guidelines and rules.
- As part of your registration, you completed a medical release form. This provides our staff and camp nurse with emergency medical information. If that information has changed, please contact our Student Ministry Staff.
- Additionally, as part of your registration process, you signed the Code of Conduct. Please be aware of the potential consequences to behavior that violates that commitment.

CELL PHONES

- We believe that Beach Camp is an opportunity for each of us to “unplug” and reset from the busyness of our lives. For many of us, that reset will happen best when we remove distractions and connections from our phones. This is an opportunity to choose to be more present with your friends and with Jesus by not being consumed with your screen.
- **NEW IN 2026:** PHONE FREE TIMES. Phones will only be permitted during specific times in the schedule: Lunch, Free-Time and nightly after Small Groups. All other times are “phone-free”. *Phones are permitted for the travel days to and from Panama City Beach.*

BEACH CAMP FAQs

Will there be adult supervision in every condo room?

Yes. Safety and security are our primary concerns. We will have at least one adult leader in every lodging space. These leaders have been background checked and gone through safety training prior.

Will students be available to roam freely at any time during Beach Camp or will they be in a supervised environment?

Students will always have adult supervision during Beach Camp. Adult sponsors and staff are strategically organized to provide for supervision throughout the camp schedule and programming. Additionally, students will travel and go through their daily schedule with their small group and leader.

What do I do with my student's medication?

All medication **MUST** be turned in to the camp nurse prior to leaving for Beach Camp. Medication must be turned in with a Ziploc bag and a completed medication dosage/instructions form.

What if my student has a food allergy?

All food allergies and medical conditions need to be documented on the GABC Medical Release and reported to the camp nurse. Certain food allergies can be accommodated at Beach Camp. Please contact the Student Ministry Office for more information.

What are the transportation arrangements?

Students and leaders will be transported to, and from Panama City Beach via charter buses. When needed, students will travel on those same buses locally around PCB.

Can my student order GrubHub or DoorDash while at camp?

While the majority of your student's meals are covered in their camp registration costs, some students may choose to have food delivered to camp. All food deliveries must occur during afternoon Free Time and not at other times of the day. Students are not permitted to leave camp property to purchase food or for order pickups.

Beach Camp Guidelines and Rules

CAMP RULES ARE AN EXTENSION OF THE STUDENT MINISTRY CODE OF CONDUCT

1. Students are expected to participate in all activities: REC, Large & Small Group sessions, Breakouts, etc.
2. Modesty in clothing is expected. Bring appropriate 1-piece/Tankini swimsuit. NO spaghetti strap shirts, DOLLAR RULE APPLIES! See our Summer Must Haves handout for suggestions.
3. Any damage to your room is the responsibility of the students assigned to that room. Go ahead....play around, mess your room up...see what happens.
4. Condo Time means just that. No leaving of your condo room during quiet hours (each night until 7am). Violation of quiet hours could result in being sent home.
5. No alcohol, tobacco, vape, or illegal drugs allowed. No guns, knives, or fireworks. Don't do dumb this week.
6. Students are not allowed to leave camp property (The Majestic Beach Resort).
7. No guys in girl's rooms and No girls in guy's rooms. Stay in your own condo!
8. Respect the privacy and property of others. Stay out of other people's stuff!
9. Absolutely NO P.D.A. (Public Display of Affection) Why? It's tough for us to see and you're not married.
10. No pranking, hazing or bullying...period. We have a zero-tolerance policy in regard to pranks.
11. Phone Policy: Phones are allowed during Lunch, Free-Time and nightly after Small Groups. All other times and activities are "phone free" and phones can be confiscated if brought out.

Failure to comply with the Camp Guidelines and Rules may result in being sent home at your Parent's Expense.

KEY TERMS:

Small Groups: Students will have assigned small groups with an adult leader and other students of their same age/gender. This will be place for discussion and growth during the week.

Silent Sounds: Beachfront daily quiet time, prayer and personal devotional.

Lunch Prep: All camp participants will help make their own lunches each morning.

Morning Celebration: Large group assembly with highlights, games, news and information on the happenings of camp (conference center).

REC: Beachfront games and competitions, held on Monday and Wednesday morning. Teams are pre-assigned, and students are expected to come dressed in support of their color team.

Breakouts: Special interest/topical breakout sessions (conference center).

Worship: Large group worship and teaching (conference center)

Not So Late Night: It's Late Night, but earlier. Block parties and good times with your friends

Summer Must-Haves

Girls

- Sleeveless shirts that have 2in across the shoulder.
- Shirts that cover all parts of the bra, cleavage, and stomach.
- Shorts that are visible at all times, and follow the \$1 Rule.
The \$1 Rule: 6inches from the knee, length-wise. 🇺🇸
- Leggings with a long shirt that cover the front and backside.
- Skirts and dresses that follow the \$1 Rule.
- Modest 1-Piece Swimsuits that cover 1/2 up the back.
- Modest Tankinis with no more than 2 inches of skin showing when arms are raised.
- Swimsuits must have 2 straps.



NOT ALLOWED

Spaghetti straps, off the shoulder, halter, backless, racerback, or one strap shirts.

Shorts or pants with writing on the backside or volleyball/biker style shorts.

Bikinis, high-waisted bikinis, mesh, cut-outs, low-cut, deep v, halter, strapless, high thigh, or cheeky swimsuits.

Guys

- T-shirts and tank tops.
- Appropriate shorts in size, length, and tightness.
- Swim shorts that are loose, appropriate in size, length, and tightness.

NOT ALLOWED

Shirts with offensive language, symbols, or images.

Shorts and pants with holes in inappropriate places.

Swim shorts that have holes, see-thru material, or Speedo type suits.
