Message from the Pastor

Do you feel that you were born for some important reason or purpose? How did you come to feel that way or come to realize your divine purpose? In my own life, I have experienced a feeling like this in my call to ministry. When I engaged in ministry and mission in the local church, it just felt like that was what I was supposed to do. It wasn't as though I operated without fear or doubt. It was more of a sense that the next steps in



this direction were the right ones for me.

Theologians argue that we were born to reflect God's image to the world. Sin has a way of wrecking this image, but it can be rebuilt in faith and in our service to others. The more that we do what God calls us to do, we reflect God and His Son, our Savior, to the world. One of the clearest ways that we reflect God to others is through our generosity. We were, as one author put it, born to be generous. If God is truly generous and we are made in His image, then we were born to be generous.

God's generosity is seen in His continual patience with His own people as well in the sending of His own Son, Jesus Christ, to the world. During the month of October, we will look to the Bible to find what it means for us to discover our own unique calling in terms of generosity as well as how God is calling our church family to respond to His call for our church's ministry and mission. As you well know, we are in the final months of the one-year capital campaign we began in 2020. We began this campaign with the hope of Preserving Beauty in the restoration and protection of our stained-glass windows as well as in protecting our Sanctuary and historic organ with a new chiller. We also began this campaign with the hope of Preserving Ministry in the process of obtaining enough funds in our church's annual operating budget for the continuing debt service of our loan.

Everyone in our church has the opportunity to give to our Preserving Beauty, Preserving Ministry one-year capital campaign. We are so very close to reaching our goal. Half of the windows are already restored and the chiller has been delivered. We are also very close to receiving enough funds for our 2021 debt service. Our mission and ministry continue to thrive because of the generosity of our wonderful church family. We cannot finish this important campaign without you!


