Message from the Pastor

The trend towards nostalgia amplified during the pandemic. It was all too common to have reboots of movies or television shows beforehand, but it has really picked up in the last year as people have turned back to soul-soothing traditions and familiar entertainment to binge watch. During times of stress or in facing the unknown, we often turn back to the places or sources of comfort and joy.



All the way back in 2017, Stephanie Remington of the Lewis Center for Church Leadership saw this trend happening in her community, especially during Advent and Christmas. She wrote: "We want to hear the same Scriptures and stories. We want to see the familiar colors and lights and decorations. We want to sing the same familiar hymns. We want to eat the same foods. We want to participate in the same activities – stringing popcorn and cranberries, thumbing through the Sears Wish Book, watching the same old movies, or baking Christmas cookies."

Her point is that while traditions help give us meaning and grounding, they can also serve as a means of grace for us. They can serve as a way for us to "experience God's grace through others—not only to find comfort in the midst of loss, but to find hope in the refreshed hearing of God's promise for the world..." Traditions can be nostalgic pathways that take us on to something more.

I hope that for you and your family this Advent and Christmas. I hope that you will bring out the same old traditions – but to look at them with new eyes. I hope that you will treasure the stories and memories and ask what differences they have made in your life and in your faith. I hope that you will attend worship and allow the Chrismon tree and the Advent Wreath to transport you into God's steadfast promises in Christ Jesus. And I hope that as you pass the flame to others on Christmas Eve that you remember our shared call to take the light we receive in Christ out into the world.

I also hope that you will invite others to join in these powerful traditions whether they be in your own home or here at your church. Invite people into this sacred season and see how they are also transported by the Holy Spirit onto the pathway to something more. As Remington concluded in 2017: "The spirit and story of Christmas...is the one story most longed for and celebrated regardless of our religious affiliations. What an opportunity to share the good news."

Since its beginning in 2012, Giving Tuesday has grown into a global movement that inspires hundreds of millions of people to give, collaborate, and celebrate generosity.

Giving Tuesday is always five days after the U.S. Thanksgiving Day, so this year it falls on November 30th.

CELEBRATING GIFTS AND YEAR-END GIVING

Churches typically receive as much as 25% of their gifts in the last two months of the year. Changing tax laws may impact your giving options. As you make your plans to complete your 2021 financial commitment, here is some additional information to help you with your giving decisions. Please note that this information is listed for educational purposes. Please consult your personal financial advisor to know what is best for their circumstances.

SPECIAL TAX INCENTIVES EXTENDED FOR 2021

In 2021, cash contributions (checks, cash, ACH, etc.) are deductible up to 100% of a donor's adjusted gross income (AGI). Ordinarily, these deductions are limited to 60% of AGI.

RETIREMENT PLANS - IRA CHARITABLE ROLLOVER

Donors who are 70 1/2 or older can make a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from their IRA of up to \$100,000 annually. Donating from a retirement account offers the donor the opportunity to make a donation without experiencing capital gains taxation. The QCD should be donated directly to your organization and is exempt from income tax to the donor. As always, encourage your members to seek advice from their personal financial advisors.

GIFTS OF APPRECIATED STOCKS OR BONDS

As in prior years, donors may be able to decrease their tax liabilities by contributing stocks, bonds, or mutual funds that have experienced capital gains. Donors receive an income tax charitable deduction for the value of the security when they make the donation to their church or non-profit. The donor is able to avoid paying taxes on the capital gains they would have paid if they had sold the security rather than donated it. To receive this benefit, it is important to transfer ownership before the security is sold. For your gift to apply to the current tax year, the securities must be in the account of the local church (or our Foundation) by December 31st. So, allow plenty of lead time for your broker to complete this transaction.

GIFTS OF REAL ESTATE

A charitable gift of real estate can be especially tax advantageous. If a home, vacation home, acreage or farm property has appreciated in value over the years - its sale could result in a sizable capital gains tax. If the real estate is given to the church prior to the sale, you can avoid the tax and realize a charitable deduction for the full fair market value of the real estate. One could even consider a bargain sale transaction with half of the funds to the church and the other half to the donor.

GIFTS OF LIFE INSURANCE

When you name the church as the owner and beneficiary of a life insurance policy, it usually offers you a tax advantage in the year you make the gift. You can take a charitable deduction approximately equal to the cash value at the time of the gift. Additionally, continued payments of premiums may qualify as charitable tax deductions each year.

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

As Thanksgiving has recently passed and Christmas is fast approaching, it seems a great time to reflect on and celebrate the ways God has blessed the Children's Ministry at Bluff Park UMC in the midst of an unpredictable 2021. In the past year:



- The Children's Ministry packed, delivered, and hid Easter Eggs for over 60 families of our church and community.
- We offered an in person Camp on the Bluff and Vacation Bible School for the children of our church.
- The children of our church packed school supply starter kits for 150 children in Bluff Park who were in need of them, and these supplies were delivered at the beginning of the school year.
- A Halloween Drive Thru for our community was offered in the parking lot of our church, and each car that came through was greeted by the smiling faces of our church members, heard about our church through their car radios, and received bags of candy from our church.
- A weekly virtual Children's Church service was offered throughout the year for those in our congregation and community who were unable to attend our in person worship services due to Covid-19 concerns.
- We continued to provide age appropriate Bibles to the children of our church at three key points throughout their spiritual journey: when they are baptized, when they enter Kindergarten, and when they enter the 3rd grade.
- In all of our ministries, we continue to teach the children of our church and our community how much God loves them, how they can form a relationship with God through Jesus Christ, how they can grow in that relationship, and how they can share the love of God with others!

God has truly blessed the Children's Ministry in 2021, and we could not have accomplished everything above without the help of such a loving and caring congregation. Whether you prayed for us, volunteered with us, contributed your tithes and offerings, or loved on the children of our church in any way, we could not have done it without you! Thank you for investing in the lives of the children of our church and our community, and thank you for helping us have such a great year! Merry Christmas!


