Sunday Morning December 11th @ 10:00am

Bluff Park UMC Chancel Choir will be presenting The Oratorio de Noël, Op. 12, by Camille Saint Saëns, also known as his Christmas Oratorio. This major work is a cantata-like work scored for soloists, chorus, organ, strings and harp. While an organist at La Madeleine, Saint-Saëns wrote the Christmas Oratorio in less than two weeks in 1858, completing it ten days before its premiere on Christmas 1858.

The work will feature five professional soloists, three of whom are Mr. DeWeese's former students now singing professionally, Emily Yocum Black, soprano, Natalie Krumpansky, contralto, and Jacob Waid, baritone. The mezzo-soprano role will be sung by Dr. Emily Jaworski Koriath, voice faculty member at UAB, and Caleb Clark, local professional tenor from the Birmingham area. The work is scored in ten movements where the Chancel Choir will be singing on six of the movements. The work will be sung in English and will tell the story of the coming of the Christ Child from the account in the gospel of Luke. The soloist and choir will be accompanied by a professional string orchestra, harp and organ.

This is an excellent time to invite your family and friends to attend our Sunday morning worship service on December 11th @ 10:00am, to experience this magnificent musical presentation by our music ministry.

CELEBRATING GIFTS AND YEAR-END GIVING

Churches typically receive as much as 25% of their gifts in the last two months of the year. Changing tax laws may impact your giving options. As you make your plans to complete your 2022 financial commitment, here is some additional information to help you with your giving decisions. Please note that this information is listed for educational purposes. Please consult your personal financial advisor to know what is best for their circumstances.

RETIREMENT PLANS - IRA CHARITABLE ROLLOVER

Donors who are 70 1/2 or older can make a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from their IRA of up to \$100,000 annually. Donating from a retirement account offers the donor the opportunity to make a donation without experiencing capital gains taxation. The QCD should be donated directly to your organization and is exempt from income tax to the donor. As always, encourage your members to seek advice from their personal financial advisors.

GIFTS OF APPRECIATED STOCKS OR BONDS

As in prior years, donors may be able to decrease their tax liabilities by contributing stocks, bonds, or mutual funds that have experienced capital gains. Donors receive an income tax charitable deduction for the value of the security when they make the donation to their church or non-profit. The donor is able to avoid paying taxes on the capital gains they would have paid if they had sold the security rather than donated it. To receive this benefit, it is important to transfer ownership before the security is sold. For your gift to apply to the current tax year, the securities must be in the account of the local church (or our Foundation) by December 31st. So, allow plenty of lead time for your broker to complete this transaction.

GIFTS OF REAL ESTATE

A charitable gift of real estate can be especially tax advantageous. If a home, vacation home, acreage or farm property has appreciated in value over the years – its sale could result in a sizable capital gains tax. If the real estate is given to the church prior to the sale, you can avoid the tax and realize a charitable deduction for the full fair market value of the real estate. One could even consider a bargain sale transaction with half of the funds to the church and the other half to the donor.

GIFTS OF LIFE INSURANCE

When you name the church as the owner and beneficiary of a life insurance policy, it usually offers you a tax advantage in the year you make the gift. You can take a charitable deduction approximately equal to the cash value at the time of the gift. Additionally, continued payments of premiums may qualify as charitable tax deductions each year.

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

As Thanksgiving has recently passed and Christmas is fast approaching, it seems a great time to reflect on and celebrate the ways God has blessed the Children's Ministry at Bluff Park UMC in 2022. In the past year:

- The number of children in our church and our community who attend our Midweek Meetup Program on Wednesday nights grew significantly over the past year!
- The number of children in our nursery tripled in size this year compared to last year!
- The number of children who attended Children's Church almost doubled in size this year as compared to last year!
- We provided age appropriate Bibles to the children of our church at special milestones in their lives (Baptism, Kindergarten, 3rd Grade)!
- We offered in person Camp on the Bluff and Vacation Bible School during the summer, which was attended by 200 children from our church and community!
- The children of our church packed school supply starter kits for 150 children in Bluff

- Park, and the children of our church and community also collected over \$800 for Room 35226+ at VBS this year!
- We offered our Community Wide Easter Egg Hunt and Halloween Carnival in person this year, and developed relationships with many families in our community!
- In all of our ministries, we continue to teach the children of our church and our community how much God loves them, how they can have a relationship with God through Jesus Christ, how they can grow in that relationship, and how they can share the love of God with others!

God has truly blessed the Children's Ministry in 2022, and we could not have accomplished everything above without the help of such a loving and caring congregation. Whether you prayed for us, volunteered with us, contributed you tithes and offerings, or loved on the children of our church in any way, we could not have done it without you! Thank you for investing in the lives of the children of our church and our community, and thank you for helping us have such a great year! *Merry Christmas!*


