Sermon Notes

"Did He Rise From Death?" 1Cor.15:3-6, 12-20

The Resurrection of Jesus Christ is not just a historical FACT but can and should be a daily reality of FAITH powerfully transforming every part of our lives.

THE RESURRECTION IS A MATTER... FACT

Biblical Evidence (1) It was prophesied in advance. (Isa53:8-12) (2) Jesus predicted His resurrection. (Matt12:38-40; Mark 8:31; 9:31; 10:33-34; Jn2:18-22) (3) Jesus died on the Cross. (Jn19:34-35) (4) Jesus was buried in a tomb that was easy to find. (Isa53:9; Matt. 27:57-60) (5) Jesus appeared physically alive three days after his death. (Matt28:9; Jn20:17; Jn20:20-28; Luke24:36-43) (6) Jesus resurrection was recorded as Scripture shortly after it occurred. (Mark 14:53, 54, 60, 61, 63) (7) Jesus' resurrection was celebrated in the earliest church creeds. (1Cor15:1-3) (8) Jesus' resurrection convinced his <u>family</u> to worship him as God. (Jn7:5; 1Cor15:7; James1:1; Acts 12:17; 15:12-21; 21:18; Gal2:9; Acts1:14; Jude 1) (9) Jesus' resurrection was confirmed by his most bitter enemies, such as Paul. (Phil3:4-6; Acts 7:54-60; Acts9)

Circumstantial Evidence

If you don't believe in the resurrection the burden of proof is on you to explain the overwhelming circumstantial evidence. (1) <u>Transformation</u> of the disciples. (Jn20:19) (2) The Disciples' loyalty to their Messiah. (3) The Character of the disciples. (4) The <u>Day</u> of worship. (Acts 20:7; 1Cor16:1-2) (5) The object of worship. (6) Theological changes in the church. (7) <u>Women</u> discovering the empty tomb. (Mark 15:40, 47; 16:1) (8) Early church preaching. (9) The tomb not Enshrined. (10) <u>Growth</u> of the church.

FAITH

Even if you can't believe in the resurrection, you should want it to be true because, it's the "happily ever after" we all long for. **1)** It is the <u>hinge</u> upon which the story of the world pivots. 1Cor15:1-3

- 2) It proves that Jesus is who He said He is. Jn14:6; 6:35
- 3) It is God stamping "Paid in Full" for our sins. Vv3-4
- 4) It means that we can enter the "Holy of Holies." Mark15:38
- **5)** It means we have His resurrection power <u>within us</u>. Rom8:11; Eph1:19-20
- 6) It means no death for us. John11:25
- 7) It means we can be <u>bold</u> and take greater <u>risks</u> with our lives for Christ. Acts4:13, 15:26
- 8) It is the promise of new heavens & new earth. Rev21:1; Isa65:17
- 9) It is the promise of new minds, hearts, and bodies. 1Cor15:35-58
- **10)** It means our bad things will work for our good, our good things can never be lost and the best things are <u>yet to come</u>. Rom8:28-30; 2Cor6:10
