The MOTIVE for our Generosity

- NOT fear and/or pride but <u>Love</u>. 1John4:19; 2Cor5:14-15
- Because God is <u>Gracious</u> (Ex34:1-9), <u>Jealous</u> (vv10-28), and <u>Glorious</u> (vv29-35)! Ex34 Renewing the Covenant

The MEASURE of our Generosity

- If we think God needs us to save the world not only will we take some of the glory but end up living a guilt driven and burned-out life rather than a grace driven and vibrant life. Isa42:8; Ps50:12
- We are not called to be co-messiah's but <u>conduits of His Grace</u>: He leads; we follow. He commands; we obey. He supplies; we steward. He delivers; we worship. Phil4:13, 19
- Generosity is not about what we can do for God in the world; it's about consistently, willingly, joyfully, sacrificially, and expectantly doing what God's Spirit <u>leads us to do</u>. 1Cor16:2; 2Cor8:3-4, 9:6-8
- If you're feeling burned out it's because you are either trying to do <u>more</u> than He has assigned you or you're trying to do what He has assigned you <u>in your own strength</u>. Matt11:28-30
- You don't need to feel guilty over what you're not doing <u>if you're doing</u> what God has assigned you to do. Don't compare sacrifices but obey your assignment. 1Cor4:2; John 21:20-22
