The physical change on the property is important but what is most important is people. We continue to move forward following Jesus not for our name but because of His. We pray for and desire that many will know Jesus as their Lord and Savior. We also desire disciples following wholeheartedly after Jesus.

Weariness may come as we do good but we are called to persist. The Word teaches us a harvest will come if we do not give up. The people we pray for matter. You matter. You are part of FBC. You are part of the body of Christ around the world. Our role is to do good to ALL people. Yet, as Paul instructed, our focus will be upon the needs to be caring for and doing good for fellow followers of Jesus.


In the days, weeks, months, and years ahead, I pray that we will continue to pull together. Together in prayer, worship, service, giving, relationships, ministry, and mission.

What is leadership? It's influence on others. If you're influencing others (positively or negatively), that makes you a leader, whether or not you have a fancy title of "Captain" or "President" or "Manager" or anything else to "make you a leader". You're not a leader if you don't have someone following you (and I don't mean that in a social media sense). Therefore, being a good leader is all about having good people skills. There is of course no better example of a leader than to look at Jesus. While He never really talks about leadership in the Gospels, there are many things we can learn from Jesus and His ministry and interactions with others about how to lead.

We're spending time this month looking at leadership and hearing from our various leaders what God has laid on their hearts to share with us. One leadership principle that has really struck me over the years is one Jesus demonstrates that probably isn't talked about very much. Vulnerability. Good leaders lead with vulnerability. Take a look at the interaction Jesus has with the Father and with His disciples in the Garden of Gethsemane in Matthew 26:36-46. He is at one of His lowest points, honestly wondering whether He can go through with what He's about to face, and yet He continues to pray to the Father and surrender to His control while He surrounds Himself with good community. Jesus knew what was demanded of Him, but He was willing to go through with it because He knew what it would bring about. His death brought us life. His love and grace have brought us a renewed sense of purpose and have given us the opportunity for true depth of relationship, knowing and being known.

Be thinking this Easter season how you can be pursuing others in deeper community because of how Jesus has pursued you. It's not easy being vulnerable but good leaders lead with vulnerability. See others, especially as they walk through storms. And let's do a better job being in community than Jesus' disciples did when He was at His lowest: falling asleep on Jesus, denying Him, and running away in His most dire moment. We need to come alongside each other, love each other, and point each other towards God as we provide a safe place for honest, authentic relationship.
