

FAMILY ACTIVITY




FAMILY DISCUSSION

- · What is most exciting to you about God having a plan for you?
- Read Jeremiah 29:11. What do we usually put as the foundation of our plans?
 - Is it love? Is it something else?

Have kids go around taking turns removing one block and placing it on top of the stack.


Play until the tower falls over, and repeat if you have time.

FAMILY ACTIVITY: YOUR YES!


Print and cut this week's printable and hand one out to each kid. On the back of the card, tell kids to write something that they are going to say yes to this week. These things may be hard to do, but they can do it because of love (e.g., help around the house, give someone a genuine compliment, make someone smile).

After they have written their idea down, play twenty questions using only yes or no questions only to guess what they wrote!

There are a lot of things we can do to say yes to. But remember you can't just say yes – you need to follow through with action. Jesus said yes to God's plans then obeyed God every step of the way.


We can follow Jesus' example and say yes to God's plans for us!
