DAY 2 Read Genesis 37

Jacob, remember that guy? Keep in mind now that God actually changed his name, you can read that in Genesis 35:10-11, his new name was "Israel." Sound familiar? There is now the country of Israel. God's promise was fulfilled! Back to the story... at this point, Israel (Jacob) had a lot of sons.

Remember that family drama? It continued on. Joseph, who was 17 at the time, was the all-time favorite. Yes, parents aren't supposed to have favorites and love their kids equally, but apparently his dad didn't pay attention to that.

His dad loved him so much that he got Joseph a nice fancy coat with all the colors, and you can probably guess just how the brothers reacted...not well, to the point that they hated him. More and more, the brothers wanted to get rid of Joseph, and that's what they did. They threw him into an empty well and then sold him as a slave.

DAY 3

Read Genesis 39:1-6

Here we find ourselves reading today that Joseph has now been sold as a slave to work in Potiphar's house.

DAY 4 **Genesis 39:21–23**

You know the saying "piece of cake," which means something that is easy to do? Joseph probably wished he could say, "Ah, this is all just a piece of cake!" But the guy just kept having problem after problem!

Now, because Potiphar's wife told a lie about him, he ended up in prison for something he didn't do! Not a "piece of cake" situation for Joseph...

Read verse 23 from our reading and write down what you read.

Hold on... isn't this the same thing that happened earlier before Joseph was in prison? Yep! That's correct! The Lord WAS WITH Joseph and gave him SUCCESS. Even in prison!

You know what? Even in a mess, it's a "piece of cake" for God to help us in the ups and downs, as Joseph could tell you and many others. Joseph eventually was able to be freed from prison, and God was going to use him even more for His great big plan! Even though it may feel like a mess, God has a plan. We can trust Him!

Genesis 42-45

At this point, Joseph is out of prison and is second in command over all of Egypt. There's now a famine (there is hardly any food left), and his brothers travel all the way to Egypt to get some food!

The brothers have no idea they are talking to Joseph, but Joseph instantly knows it's them. Can you imagine? These are people who hated him and sold him into slavery; Joseph could have done whatever he wanted to them! But to their surprise, he showed them mercy.

Go to the end of Genesis, chapter 50, verse 20. Joseph tells his brothers, "You planned to harm me. But God planned it for good." Joseph could see that God was doing something bigger; he didn't get hung up on the drama.

Joseph went through a lot, but could trust God even when things got tough.

We can too.
