LIFE - WEEK 3 (Scripture: John 10 - primarily 7-13)

- 1. What do the sheep, shepherd, the sheep pen and stranger represent in this week's scriptures?
- 2. What do you think Jesus means when he describes himself as the "door of the sheep"?
- 3. Describe the many ways Jesus is opposite of the stranger/thief.
- 4. How has the stranger/thief shown up in your life to derail you?
- 5. In vs. 10 Jesus says he has come so that we may have life to the full. What does that mean for the Christian?
- 6. It was said in the weekend message that our soul has an appetite. What do you think your soul is searching for?
- 7. Describe what an abundant life is according to the world. How does that differ from the abundant life found in Christ?
- 8. How have you heard the Shepherd's voice in your life? Describe some times when that was most real to you.
- 9. Jesus desires to care for you as the Good Shepherd. How have you allowed him to do so?
- 10. As you have grown in your knowledge and trust in Christ, how has this changed your view of the "abundant life"? (check these out: Jeremiah 29:11, Matthew 6:33, John 1:1-5, Jeremiah 20:13, John 11:25)

5 Things to Pray for Your Group

Chances are that you've gone to some small group meetings over the last couple of months. Perhaps you're a new group just getting to know each other; perhaps you've been meeting together for years. Either way, you no doubt want God to be at work in your group—so it's a good idea to ask Him. Here are 5 things for your fellowship together, based on Colossians 3 v 15-17:

Heavenly Father, please help us to...

1. Be at peace; "Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts." (v 15)

2. Teach one another; "Let the message of Christ dwell among you richly as you teach ... one another." (v 16)

3. Admonish one another; Small groups should be an environment where Christians can "admonish one another with all wisdom" (v 16).

4. Love each other; ... both in "word" and "deed", "in the name of the Lord Jesus" (v 17).
5. Be truly thankful; see verses 15, 16 and 17! "Be thankful ... with gratitude in your hearts ... giving thanks to God the Father." (Rachel Jones | thegoodbook.com | 9/24/15)
