WATCH THE TEACHING VIDEO BY PASTOR KEITH CHAPMAN

FOR - HEAVEN (Scripture: John 14:1-6, Revelation 21:3-5)

- 1. What were your earliest thoughts of heaven?
- 2. It was said in the weekend message that we live in a short-term thinking society, filled with instant gratification, 140 character news feeds, etc. Do you feel that you have bought into that way of thinking?
- 3. Read John 14:1-6. Why do you think Jesus says in vs. 1, "let your hearts not be troubled"?
- 4. What comfort is it to you to know that Jesus will bring us (Christians) to himself with the Father?
- 5. Describe how often you think of being in heaven, and should we think about it more?
- 6. Do you long for heaven? And, if so, why?
- 7. Read Rev. 21:3-5. What emotions do you have about being directly with God for all of eternity?
- 8. In the weekend message it was said that Jesus is for us being with him forever, together, perfectly. Verse 4 speaks to that. Does this change the way you think about pain and sorrow on this side of heaven?
- 9. How would you talk about heaven to others?
- 10. How can our understanding of and longing for heaven be more a part of our lives?

ACTION STEP

The action step out of the weekend message was to ask yourself the question; "What would change if I really believed that Jesus is forever, together, perfectly?"

SHEPHERDING / CARE / PRAYER

Are you planning to connect with each person in your group before the group season ends? It would be a very helpful idea to plan this. You will want to know how did they grow in their faith, what steps of progress did they take, what are they planning for the fall, etc.?
